

VII. Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM)

Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM) is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme launched on 3rd December 2005 and is:

- Single largest central government initiative in the urban sector.
- Investment potential of around 50,000 crores.
- Planned for 63 cities with a population of around 10 lakhs
 - Covering state capitals
 - Cities of religious and tourist importance
- Duration of 7 years beginning from 2005-06.

The “Pondicherry Town” has also been selected as one of the Mission cities.

Objectives :

- Focused attention to integrated development of infrastructural services in the cities covered under the mission.
- Secure effective linkages between asset creation and asset management so that the infrastructural services created in the cities are not only maintained efficiently but also become self-sustaining overtime.
- Ensure adequate investment of funds to fulfill deficiencies in the urban infrastructural services.
- Planned development of identified cities including peri-urban areas, outgrowths, urban corridors, so that urbanization takes place in a dispersed manner.
- Scale up delivery of civic amenities and provision of utilities with emphasis on universal access to urban poor.
- To take up urban renewal program, i.e. Re-developmetn of inner (old) cities area to reduce congestion.
