## **Budget Takes Central Schemes to 33**

New Delhi: The budget has increa sed the number of centrally sponsored schemes to 33 from 31 now, adding three new schemes while doing away with one old scheme and replacing one with a new scheme.

The exercise has resulted in a jump of 12.3% in cumulative budgetary al-

mes(CSS) to ₹3.81 lakh crore in 2021-22 from ₹3.39 lakh crore budgeted in 2020-21. However, the allocation for the next fiscal is slightly lower than the revised estimates for 2020-21 of ₹3.87 lakh crore after a substantial increase of ₹40,000 crore was made to the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee scheme amid the pandemic.

The new schemes proposed to be added under CSS in the next fiscal include Mission Shakti for protection and empowerment of women with an allocation of ₹3,109 crore, Rashtriya Pashudhan Vikas Yojana for cattle and livestock development (₹1,177,04 crore), Mission Vatsalya for protec-

tion and wel ren (₹900 croand Saksham

di and Poshan 2.0 to strengthen nutri-tional content, delivery, outreach, and outcome, with an allocation of 20,705 crore. Saksham Anganwadi and Poshan 2.0 will replace the um-brella Integrated Child Development

Services (ICDS) scheme, finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman said in her budget speech on Monday. The ICDS scheme, a

The government has in recent years rationalised the number of centrally sponsored schemes, bringing it down to 28 in FY17 from 66 earlier. On the recommendation of the Fif-

teenth Finance Commission, we have undertaken a detailed exercise to rationalise centrally sponsored sche-mes. This will enable consolidation of outlays for better impact," Sithara-man said in her budget speech.

As part of the ongoing rationalisation exercise, the government has also given flexibility to states to administer the related schemes in line with state-specific requirements. The Fifteenth Finance Commission

has suggested the government fix up, a threshold amount of annual appropriation below which the funding for a CSS may be slopped. "Below the stipulated threshold, the administrative ministry, should justify the needs ve ministry should justify the need for the continuation of the scheme, the commission said.

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
