
MEETING NOTICE

OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: End-to-end Digitisation of State DBT Schemes and their on-boarding on Mobile Platform on the occasion of the 75th Anniversary of Indian Independence- regarding.

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The DBT Mission, Cabinet Secretariat, is entrusted with the responsibility of ensuring successful implementation of Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) schemes of the Government. With the aforesaid objective, this Office has been facilitating and monitoring the progress of DBT Schemes of the Union Ministries / Departments / State Governments and Union Territories.

2. To coincide with the 75th Anniversary of Indian Independence, i.e. 15th August 2022, the Government has now set a target to ensure that **major DBT schemes**, including those implemented by State/ UT Governments, are end-to-end digitised and made available on Mobile Platforms, especially on UMANG by **31st March 2022**.

3. To ensure seamless and transparent delivery of major DBT Schemes to the citizens, State Governments/ UT Administrations are required to develop IT-based platforms which are end-to-end digitized, which inter-alia includes: (a) online registration of beneficiaries; (b) computerised processing and (c) electronic payments directly into the beneficiary's bank account. States/UTs may also consider exempting smaller schemes from digitisation, depending on the number of beneficiaries, life cycle of the scheme, financial outlay, nature of beneficiaries etc.


4. It is requested that State/UTs may **review the status of digitisation of the major State/UT DBT Schemes** and **ensure their end-to-end digitisation** at the earliest. The States/ UTs may do so using their own resources/platform/portal. However, if the State/ UT faces any difficulty due to technical or resource constraints, it may consider a product called **ServicePlus**, developed by the NIC, Ministry of Electronics and IT. ServicePlus is a configurable solution offering a host of services including Aadhaar Authentication using OTP; fetching of verified digital documents through DigiLocker; and integration with PFMS and UMANG. It also supports eSign and Digital Signature Certificate (DSC). DBT Mission, Cabinet Secretariat will provide guidance on Service Plus configuration by sharing key documents, SOPs, review meetings etc.

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5. Further, with a view to strengthening Mobile governance and to improve beneficiary experience, it is essential that with all major DBT Schemes are made available on a mobile interface through an App. This may be achieved by bringing them directly on **UMANG**, which is an aggregator App, developed by National e-Governance Division (NeGD), Ministry of Information Technology, Govt. of India. UMANG is available in thirteen Indian languages and has a host of facilities like State based cataloguing, integration with ServicePlus, Digilocker, RAS, etc.

6. In order to achieve this target by 31.03.2022 and to ensure better monitoring and support, relevant information may kindly be provided in the format as per enclosed questionnaire at Annexure by email (js.dbt@nic.in) at the earliest. The questionnaire will also be made available in the respective State/ UT logins on DBT Bharat portal (www.dbtbharat.gov.in), to enable real time feedback.
