Record of Discussion chaired by Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister on July 07, 2020 at 11:30 AM regarding review of Flagship Schemes in Union Territories (UTs).

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A meeting under the chairmanship of the Principal Secretary to the Hon'ble Prime Minister to review the implementation of flagship schemes of Government of India (GoI) was held at 11:30 AM on July 07, 2020 via Video Conference. The list of participants in the meeting is at Annexure-I. The list of flag ship schemes of GoI is at Annexure-II. Home Secretary made a presentation. A copy of the presentation made by Home Secretary is at Annexure-III.

2. At the outset, the Principal Secretary to the PM stated that the objective of the meeting was not just to review the progress made by UTs under various flagship schemes but also to drawing timelines to ensure complete saturation of these schemes in UTs. He emphasised that the meeting was being held in furtherance of Hon'ble PM's vision of making UTs, models for good governance.

3. The scheme-wise inputs of ministries/ UTs and key observations were as follows:

i.	One Nation One Ration Card	D/o Food & Public Distribution <ul style="list-style-type: none">All UTs are nearing saturation.Implementation would be completed in all UTs by October, 2020 for both NFSA beneficiaries and migrants.
ii.	Distribution of Food grains & Pulses under Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Ann Yojana (PMGKAY)	D/o Food & Public Distribution <ul style="list-style-type: none">All UTs nearing saturation. LKD has achieved 100% coverage in food grain distribution. D/o Consumer Affairs <ul style="list-style-type: none">100% saturation has been achieved in all UTs with regard to Pulses distribution.

iii.	Single Use Plastic (SUP)	M/o Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> All UTs have issued notification on complete ban of SUP. UTs of ANI and CHD are using plastic in road construction and cement factories. Alternatives to SUP (Cloth/Jute bags) need to be popularized in all UTs.

National Health (NDHM) Platform Digital Mission Tech	National Health Agency (NHA) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> NHA to prepare the tech platform and ensure its implementation by 15 August, 2020. Meeting may be taken by NHA to sensitize UTs on this initiative and to ensure that implementation deadline is adhered to. UTs to provide support for implementation, including registration.
v.	Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PMJAY)	National Health Agency <ul style="list-style-type: none"> UTs of CHD, DNH&DD and PUD have shown good progress in terms of issuance of e-Cards and number of treatments. Progress is slow in ANI and LKD. Merger of UT schemes with Ayushman Bharat has been initiated in ANI and LKD. PUD has proposed Universal Health Coverage (UHC). All eligible families need to be covered (total saturation) in a limited timeframe.
vi.	Health and Wellness Centres (HWCs)	M/o Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> All UTs have achieved the target for FY 2020-21, except ANI. LKD may upload the photographs of their 3 functional HWCs.
vii.	Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana - Grameen (PMAY-G)	M/o Rural Development (MoRD) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Cumulative Physical Progress (2016-17 to 2020-21) in terms of completed houses has been slow in ANI (14%), DNH&DD (7%) and LKD (44%).

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ANI, DNH&DD and LKD submitted that remaining houses are in different stages of construction.
viii.	Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana - Urban (PMAY-U)	<p>M/o Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> DNH&DD has been the best performing UT under the scheme while progress of ANI has been slow. Chandigarh has sent a Cabinet Note through MHA for subsidizing cost of land for PMAY-U on “No Profit No Loss” basis, i.e., @ Rs. 3.10 crore per acre. DEL has launched Mukhya Mantri Awas Yojana and is not implementing PMAY-U.
ix.	Agriculture Market Reforms	<p>M/o Agriculture and Famers Welfare (MoAFW)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> All reforms have been implemented in CHD. DEL has not implemented the reforms. Comments of MoAFW on the Bill of PUD have been received by MHA. Reforms will be implemented accordingly.
x.	National Animal Disease Control Programme (NADCP)	<p>D/o Animal Husbandry and Dairying</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Programme has been initiated in PUD. Entire Bovine Population will be covered in UTs (100% Saturation) by September, 2020.
xi.	Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY)	<p>D/o Fisheries</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> UTs to send proposals under the Scheme since this is a demand driven scheme. Special focus on ANI and LKD since the potential for fisheries is high in these two islands. Inland fisheries also need to be promoted under the Scheme.
xii.	Privatization of Power Distribution Companies in UTs	<p>M/o Power</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Transaction Advisors have been appointed for CHD and ANI. Privatization of power distribution companies in these UTs can be accomplished by 31 January, 2021.

PM SVAnidhi (Micro-credit Scheme for Street Vendors)	<p>MoHUA</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Portal has been functioning since July 2, 2020 and 52,828 applications received so far. 17,000 applications have been processed. Numbers are expected to rise. • Saturation to be achieved in Chandigarh and Port Blair by September, 2020. • MoHUA may explain the Scheme to all UTs so that the objectives of the Scheme are achieved.
xiv.	Digital Payment for Purchase of Fertilizers	<p>M/o Fertilizers</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Subsidy is paid to fertilizer companies on “Actual Sales” to eligible farmers through Point of Sale (PoS) authentication of beneficiaries. • Purchase of fertilizers by farmers has to be cashless by October 2020.
xv.	Island Development	<p>Ministry of Home Affairs</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Most (95%) of the directions of IDA meetings and the directions of Hon’ble PM have been complied with and operationalised. • RFP for development of 4 Eco-Tourism projects in ANI and 3 in LKD under process. • UTs of ANI and LKD are moving towards de-dieselization and increasingly using renewable energy. 95% de-dieselization is expected to be achieved in ANI and 93% in LKD by 2023. • Offices of Export Inspection Council and Marine Product Export Development Authority (MPEDA) set up to promote marine exports, especially Tuna Fish.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New Capital Subsidy Scheme - Lakshadweep and Andaman & Nicobar Islands Industrial Development Scheme (LANIDS) notified. • Laying of submarine Optical Fibre Cable (OFC) for the islands has been a major achievement. • Joint Team of Air Force and MoCA to identify land required for acquisition at Minicoy. • Ministry of Defence to survey the remaining 200 uninhabited and accessible islands, out of the total 1,295 islands. • NoC is awaited from MoD for civilian operations at more islands in ANI. • Sustainable Development of Little Andaman and Great Nicobar islands envisaged.
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4. After deliberations, it was decided that:

- i. All UTs to strive towards achieving full saturation of GoI schemes at the earliest, and ensure their smooth, proper, effective and complete implementation.
- ii. AtmaNirbhar package under various schemes to be complied with in a time-bound manner.
- iii. Chief Secretary, Government of NCT of Delhi may ensure implementation of national portability of ration cards and roll out of One Nation One Ration Card Scheme by October, 2020.
- iv. With regard to the distribution of food grains and pulses under PMGKAY, it must be ensured that genuine beneficiaries are benefiting from the scheme.
- v. In addition to phasing out of SUP and banning of plastic carry bags, use of SUP alternatives must also be taken up on priority. M/o Environment Forest

& Climate Change (MoEF&CC) should work towards making biodegradable alternatives available and encouraging their use.

- vi. CEO, National Health Authority (NHA) to sensitize the Chief Secretaries and Advisors to Administrators of UTs about NDHM, thereby ensuring effective implementation on ground.
- vii. CEO, NHA may review the figures and ascertain the ground realities in implementation of PMJAY. Coverage of all eligible families under the scheme to be ensured.
- viii. UTs of Andaman & Nicobar Islands (ANI), Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu (DNH&DD) and Lakshadweep (LKD) may expedite progress under PMAY-G.
- ix. The issue of separate scheme (apart from PMAY-U) in Delhi to be discussed by the Cabinet Secretary with Chief Secretary, Govt. of NCT of Delhi and a decision as to whether to continue the scheme in Delhi or not to be taken. Further, overall progress of the PMAY-U scheme in UTs to be expedited to achieve saturation.
- x. Given the relevance of the PM Matsya Sampada Yojana to non-island UTs, Chief Secretaries to look into how the scheme can promote inland fisheries, submit proposals accordingly, and ensure its implementation in their respective UTs.
- xi. Secretary, MoHUA to explain key features of the PM SVAnidhi Scheme to all UTs to ensure achievement of objectives and time bound implementation of the Scheme.
- xii. MHA to ensure complete saturation of the schemes in UTs in a time bound manner. Home Secretary will have regular meetings in this regard.
