SOCIAL WELFARE

Ours is a Welfare State committed to the welfare and development of people particularly poor and weaker sections of the society. With the objective of promoting the educational and economic interest of the weaker sections of the people with special care, the schemes under Social Welfare sector have been formulated with due emphasize on the welfare of women, children, aged, disabled and destitute.

Under the correctional services, the inmates of Observation Home and Special School were given special vocational training to make them attentive and responsible citizens. One Observation Home and a Special School for Juvenile Delinquents are functioning presently in Pondicherry region. One such Home will be started in Karakal region. A Beggar home is to be opened in Karaikal region. Handicapped Homes are run for providing education and vocational training for handicapped children. Various welfare schemes and measures were oriented with the aim of providing security and welfare to the vulnerable sections like disabled persons during the past and the same will be continued with increased tempo. Grants to voluntary organisations will be released and the quantum of the grant in aid has been enhanced from Rs.10,000/- to Rs.25,000/-.

The existing on going schemes such as 'Setting up of resort for aged, distribution of blankets and chappals for aged people and Home for /Aged and Infirm at Karaikal and starting of Vocational Rehabilitation Centre for Disabled persons etc.' will be implemented in full swing. 4 Homes and a District Rehabilitation Centre in Pondicherry region and two Homes in Karaikal region are presently run in private buildings. Hence from the next Annual Plan as well as during the course of the Tenth Plan, it is proposed to acquire/ purchase land for the construction of own buildings for the above said Homes and also for the new Homes to be opened.

2. Objective of the Scheme

Homes for Orthopaedically Handicapped children are run at Pondicherry and Karaikal regions. The aim is to give education and treatment to Physically handicapped children. The inmates are provided with free boarding and lodging. Vocational training programme are organised for the children of the age group between 12 to 18 years, during their free hours, so as to make them gain proficiency in select trades/crafts. This training will be organised with the help of private institutions/non Government Organisations.

Through the Home for Visually Handicapped and Hearing Impaired free education is provided to the visually handicapped and hearing impaired children upto 10th Standard and train them in vocal and instrumental music. The inmates are provided with free boarding and lodging, medical and educational facilities. It is proposed to construct staff quarters, store room, auditorium, hearing aid laboratory and workshop. Every year 10 new inmates will be admitted in each of home at Pondicherry and Karaikal.

A Home for Mentally Retarded Children is functioning in Pondicherry with 25 inmates. Free boarding, lodging, clothing, medical care, education and other facilities will be provided to them. The aim of the scheme is to provide medical treatment to the admitted mentally retarded children.

Through the Home for Leprosy patent it is proposed to provide adequate social security to the leprosy patients and the family members. It is proposed to open a

rehabilitation centre to accommodate the leprosy patients along with the family members who do not have proper shelter. They will be provided with food, clothing and nonformal education. Also they will be provide with vocational training for their rehabilitation.

Under Integrated Child Development Services Programme there are 677 Anganwadi centres functioning in the entire of Pondicherry. Of which 544 Anganwadi centre are functioning in the rented buildings. An amount of Rs. 4.10 lakhs is spent every year for the payment of rent of Rs. 25/- paid to the Anganwadi Centres located in rural areas and Rs. 120/- in Urban areas. Though a suitable amount is spent for payment of rent the rented buildings do not have basic amenities such as drinking water and toilet facilities. In order to avoid this it is proposed to construct Pucca buildings for 300 Anganwadi centres during 10th Five Year Plan period. Approximate cost of each land and building is estimated at Rs. 4 lakhs.

The Anganwadi Workers and Anganwadi Helpers will assist the Social Welfare Organisers in the Counselling Centre since they are in gross route level and their approach to the public will be very easy. Hence, the services of Anganwadi Workers, Anganwadi Helpers and area ANMS will be utilised on Honorarium basis.

The objective of forming Family Counselling Centre is to give knowledge to Women folk on legal literacy, opening of Bank accounts, participate in Panchayatraj activities and Government Schemes, discuss about health, atrocity against women, alcoholism, other income generating activities, record management, leadership Development, confidence building, education of the girl child, premarital and post marital counselling, prohibition of dowry, family counselling, agriculture, animal husbandry, management of credit activities, dowry prohibition etc. It also aims to sensitise the women folk to create confidence, discuss their family, economical and other social problems, bringing awareness in problems pertaining of that are like sanitation, hygiene, electrification etc.
