ANIMAL HUSBANDRY

The programmes under this sector aim at safeguarding the health of all farm animals and to sustain and further improve their productivity. The efforts are therefore directed towards development of necessary infrastructure for extending Veterinary Health coverage and breeding facilities. The livestock health delivery system being adopted is of very intensive nature. The livestock health problems are effectively tackled in a regular and routine manner by the field level institutions established at strategic points. On account of this intensive health coverage by way of treatment and control, this territory is free from any major disease casualties during the last one and half decades.

In the Annual Plan 2004-05, it is proposed to conduct 40 camps and perform 3,70,000 vaccinations under veterinary health coverage. It is also proposed to purchase 96,000 doses of frozen semen for artificial insemination. 600 elite milch animals will be selected for building up the stock and 5620 cash awards will be distributed.

It is proposed to purchase 600 bucks for distribution among women of economically backward sections for better meat production. It is proposed induct 900 female calves for distribution of subsidized feed to rear the calves. Under the Livestock Production Research & Extension programme, it is proposed to purchase 13,000 Giriraja Chicks, 19,000 Girirani Chicks and 850 Turkeys for distribution and also rearing in government farms. 40 educated rural youth will be trained in poultry farming during the plan period. Grants-in-aid will be released to Veterinary College for its activities.

2. Objective of the Scheme :

The infrastructure facility already built under livestock health coverage programme are to be further strengthened and deficiencies wherever felt have to be made good during the ensuing plan period. It is proposed to provide a shelter for the animals brought for treatment wherever possible.

Consequent on the introduction of many Livestock development Schemes and starting of various Veterinary Institutions and poultry farms in this U.T. it has become necessary to provide adequate veterinary coverage by supply of medicines, equipments, etc. to the Veterinary hospitals, Veterinary dispensary, First aid Centres, Key village Units, etc. to function effectively. With this objective in view the Central Veterinary Medical Stores and Vaccine depot is functioning at headquarter of Pondicherry. Proper assessment in respect of medicines, equipments etc., and for the periodic use at various veterinary institutions and its procurement and distributions are to be ensured in order to combat diseases and treat ailing animals & birds. It is therefore, felt necessary to strengthen the depot further. Adequate provision of vaccine for the control of contagious diseases like foot and mouth disease, BQ, HS anthrax vaccines for the animals for prophylactic purpose.

Due to intensive cross breeding programme implemented in this Union Territory, the No. of cross bred animals have become more in various parts of this territory. In order to keep the animals healthy, it is necessary to diagnose and contain any emerging disease. Diagnostic Centre and Intelligence Unit to forewarn the farmers are necessary for timely supportive action. The facilities now available in the disease investigation centre will be fully utilized and in addition will be further strengthened.

2. Objective of the Scheme :

To generate subsidiary income by rearing cross-bred Heifer calves, and to contribute towards the increased Milk production, farmers are helped to raise quality animals with good genetic potential. Farmers who are below poverty line and who own cross-bred heifer calves are assisted by giving subsidized calf feed in kind. The cash equivalent of the feed is subsidized as per the felt needs of the farmers to the extent of 50% and 66.3 % to for small farmers, marginal farmers and agricultural labourers as per the pattern of assistance in vogue

during the Ninth Plan. The non-subsidy component will be collected in cash from the farmers and paid to the feed supplier directly. During the year 2003-04, the subsidy component of the feed is raised from 50% to 75%.

To gain additional employment and to get subsidiary income to farmers male calves are to be raised for good quality beef production by supply of subsidized fattening feed.

2. Objective of the Scheme

The main thrust of the Scheme is to further improve the productivity of the cross bred cattle and thereby attract more persons to take up dairying as a subsidiary occupation. The increase in productivity of the cross bred cattle is proposed to be achieved by maintaining the exotic inheritance at level 50 to 62.50% by continuing the Artificial Insemination using frozen semen technique.

To eradicate the problem of cattle infertility, infertility camps are conducted in selected villages and cash incentive is paid to the participating farmers.

To build up an elite stock of high yielding cows by selecting the best cross bred jersey cows, which will be bred using superior quality frozen semen. The female progenies will be brought up by special care to ensure maximum production potential and calf crop from early age. The animals scheduled under the schemes will be insured for a period of 3 years. In addition the owner is also insured for Rs.1,00,000/- against the risk of death by accident. In

case of hospitalisation, medical expenses to the extend of Rs.5000/- will be reimbursed to the owner or his / her spouse. Cattle death claim will be given to an extent of Rs.12,000/- per cow.

To sustain the milk production and to help to reduce the cost of milk production support price in the farm of feed subsidy at Rs.1.50/- per kg. of feed is provided.
