#### **SOCIAL WELFARE**

Ours is a Welfare State committed to the welfare and development of people particularly to poor and weaker sections of Society. With the objective of promoting the educational and economical interest of the weaker sections of the people with special care, the schemes under Social Welfare Sector were formulated with emphasize on the welfare of children, aged, disabled and destitute and Senior Citizens.

Handicapped Homes are run for the education and providing Vocational Training for Handicapped children. Their health also taken care of especially with regard to their nature of disability. Various Welfare schemes and measures were oriented with the aim of providing security and welfare to the vulnerable sections like disabled persons during the past and the same will be continued with increased tempo. Grants to Voluntary Organisations will be released to voluntary Organisations as in the past. But the quantum of the grant in aid has been enhanced from Rs.10,000/- to Rs.25,000/- and to cover more voluntary Organisations. The additional grants will be granted to the Voluntary Organisation for maintenance higher strength (Additional Units)

The existing on going schemes such as 'Setting up of resort for aged, distribution of blankets and chappals for aged people and Home for Aged and Infirm at Karaikal and starting of Vocational Rehabilitation Centre (VRC) for Disabled persons etc.' will be implemented in full swing. Under the Correctional Services, one Observation Home and a Special School for Juvenile Delinquents are functioning presently at Pondicherry region and another one at Karaikal Region. A Beggar Home has been opened in Karaikal region as there is only one Home has been functioning at Pondicherry region. There are 4 Homes and a District Rehabilitation Centre in Pondicherry region and two Homes in Karaikal region are presently run in private buildings. Hence, it is proposed to acquire/ purchase land for the construction of own buildings for the above said Homes and also for the new Homes to be opened.

The eligibility of percentage of handicapped has been reduced from 75% to 40% for extending the benefits of various schemes for the Disabled Persons. It is proposed to increase the financial assistance from Rs.400/- p.m. to Rs.500/- p.m. to the persons with 75% disabilities and above.

Children constitute the vibrant core of society and welfare of children is to ensured for all round development. Programmes for welfare of children intend to cover those children not covered by any other schemes and aims to given them care and protection along with entertainment, encouragement and appreciation of their talent. Two new schemes are proposed to be introduced namely, State Commission for Children and Shelter Home for Street Children. 2000 children are targeted under the various programmes for the welfare of children. The socio economic status of women have improved over the year with increasing awareness about women rights and privileges. The programmes proposed for the welfare of women are Women's Day Celebration, Women's Rights Seminar, widow's daughters marriage allowance, widows remarriage, educational allowance to widows children, financial assistance to Mangalam society, kulavilakku, aravannaippu, formation of family counseling centre and financial assistance to poor brides. In order to provide comfortable and secured stay for women who are working in places away from their homes at low cost, hostels for working women are functioning in Pondicherry and Karaikal covering 65 inmates. A short stay home is to be stated by an NGO with proven service record in women's welfare with an inmate strength of 100. 25 women will be covered under rehabilitation programme for aids victim. These programmes proposed to cover 6,000 women during 2004-05.

The Women Development Corporation which is the channelising agency for financial aid for women to set up their own enterprises with the Government share and the target proposed is 2500. Under the social defence programme, it is proposed to release pension to 70,139 Old age persons and widows who have no means of income. Financial assistance will be granted towards funeral expenses of 1200 old age pensioners. Apart from this, it is proposed to grant medical expenses to 200 old age pensioners who are suffering from serious diseases. Free clothing and supply of rice to BPL families will help to mitigate their sufferings to some extent. 83,862 persons will be covered under this programme during 2004-05.

Homes for Orthopaedically Handicapped children are run at Pondicherry and Karaikal regions. The aim is to give education and treatment to Physically handicapped children. The inmates are provided with free boarding and lodging. Vocational training programme are organised for the children of the age group between 12 to 18 years, during their free hours, so as to make them gain proficiency in select trades/crafts. This training will be organised with the help of private institutions/non Government Organisations.

Through the Home for Visually Handicapped and Hearing Impaired free education is provided to the visually handicapped and hearing-impaired children upto 10<sup>th</sup> Standard and train them in vocal and instrumental music. The inmates are provided with free boarding and lodging, medical and educational facilities. It is proposed to construct staff quarters, storeroom, auditorium, hearing aid laboratory and workshop. Every year 10 new inmates will be admitted in each of home at Pondicherry and Karaikal.

A Home for Mentally Retarded Children is functioning in Pondicherry with 25 inmates. Free boarding, lodging, clothing, medical care, education and other facilities will be provided to them. The aim of the scheme is to provide medical treatment to the admitted mentally retarded children.

The main aim of the scheme is to create awareness on the early detection of handicapped,. In order to check the disabilities at the earliest, a social awareness for prevention of disabilities has to be generated and referring the detected cases to appropriate agencies for provisions of prosthetic aids and appliances to improve their condition. Under the scheme, training facility through workshops, camps and audio-visual aids, home management of disabled are proposed to be undertaken.
