

## **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT**

Under the programmes implemented by Local Administration Department, local bodies are released grants and loans to take up civic improvement works.

During 2004-2005, it is proposed to take up 200 works under MLA's Local Area Development Scheme, 10 works under composite scheme, 10 village Panchayat office building works, 6 works under Integrated Development of Villages of Religious importance, 25 improvement of burial/cremation ground works and 10 Commune Panchayats will be assisted to clear their current consumption charges bills by way of releasing grant to them.

Directorate Rural Development through its programmes, proposes to instal 42 colour TV set for the benefit of 52,500 rural mass, engagement of 356 TV caretakers, distribution of 523 sports articles to Mahila/Yuvak Mandals, release of grant in aid to 215 Mahila Mandals/Yuvak Mandals, issue of 175 cash incentive awards to Mahila/Yuvak Mandals, financial incentive awards to 1500 Self Help Group women members, contribution towards premium to 3950 members under Janashree Bima Yojana, grant of Block Level and U.T. level special incentive awards to 14 Mahila/Yuvak Mandals will be implemented during 2004-05.

SGSY was launched by GOI on April 1999 by restructuring the IRDP & Other Self-employment Programmes. It is a central sector scheme, which Covers all aspects of Self-employment such as Organization of poor into Self Help Groups, Training, Credit, Technology infrastructure & Marketing. The objective of the scheme is bring the assisted poor families above the poverty line by providing them income generating assets through a mix of Bank credit & Governmental subsidy DRDA has been implementing the central Sector scheme SGSY with effect from 1999-2000 in the U.T. The successful implementation of the SGSY scheme in the U.T has led to the formation of 841 self-help groups in the U.T and there is increasing demand for Subsidy & Credit by the groups which DRDA is not in a position to meet with Central fund alone Hence, it has been proposed to operate a separate scheme under State Plan.

The Successful implementation of the SGSY scheme in the U.T has led to the formation of 841 self-help groups in the U.T and there is increasing demand for Subsidy & Credit by the groups which DRDA is not in a position to meet with Central fund alone Hence, it has been proposed to operate a separate scheme under State Plan

**(c) Programme envisaged for Annual Plan 2004-05 :**

50% of the remaining eligible groups will be given will be considered for Revolving Fund and loan assistance
