

## **ANIMAL HUSBANDRY**

The broad objectives under this sector are to safeguard the health of all farm animals and further improve their productivity. The efforts of the department since many years were, therefore directed towards development of necessary infrastructure for extending veterinary health coverage and breeding facilities. The Livestock health delivery system, being adopted by this department, is of very intensive nature. The livestock health problems are effectively tackled in a regular and routine manner by the field level institutions established at strategic points. On account of this intensive health coverage by way of treatment and control, this territory is free from any major diseases casualties during the last one and half decades.

During 2005-06, it is proposed to do 3,70,000 preventive vaccinations to animals / birds. It is also proposed to purchase 1,25,000 doses of frozen for artificial insemination to increase productivity of cross breed cows. 1000 elite milch animals are proposed to be selected. Cash award will be distributed to 6,500 rearing female calves to build up an elite stock. It is proposed to give 75% subsidy to self help group for the purchase of 3,000 milch cows. Mini dairy unit will be given to the unemployed youth @75% subsidy to 50 persons. 2,500 female calves to be assisted and 1000 heifer calves to be distributed to widow beneficiaries on free of cost. It is proposed to purchase and distribute 11000 Giriraja Chicks, 20,000 Girirani Chicks and 3000 Turkeys Poults and 4,000 commercial chicks. 3000 farmers to be distributed 16 weeks' pullets each 5 birds on free of cost. During the year 2005-06 it is proposed to setup broiler rearing unit with 75% subsidy to 100 unemployed youths and rabbit rearing unit with 75% subsidy to 50 unemployed youths.

**1. Name of the Scheme :** Cattle Breeding Services, Infertility Control and to build up an elite stock with high yielding cross bred jersey cows.

**2. Objective of the Scheme :**

The main thrust of the Scheme is to further improve the productivity of the cross bred cattle and thereby attract more persons to take up dairying as a subsidiary occupation. To increase in productivity of the cross bred cattle is proposed to be achieved by maintaining the exotic inheritance at level 50 to 62.50% by continuing the Artificial Insemination using frozen semen technique.

To eradicate the problem of cattle infertility, infertility camps are conducted in selected villages.

Merit subsidy will be given for construction of cattle shed to protect the cross bred animals from the vagaries of nature and for hygienic milk production.

To build up an elite stock of high yielding cows by selecting the best cross bred jersey cows, which will be bred using quality frozen semen. The female progenies will be brought up by special care to ensure maximum production potential and calf crop from early age. The animals selected under the schemes will be insured for a period of 3 years. In addition the owner is also insured for Rs.1,00,000/- against the risk of death by accident. In case of hospitalisation, medical expenses to the extent of Rs.5000/- per year will be reimbursed to the owner or his / her spouse for three years. In case of Cattle death an amount of Rs.12,000/- is given as compensation .

With a view to take up dairying as a subsidiary occupation and to support the cost of production, cattle feed subsidy of Rs.2.00 per Kg. will be given to the farmers through the Co-op milk producers societies on their purchase of cattle feed from the Milk Union.

Grant of 75% subsidy for assistance to the members of Women Self Help Groups for the purchase of milch animal to improve the economic status of the poor.

Grant of 75% subsidy to unemployed youth to establish Dairy Cattle Unit. Restricted to a maximum of Rs.1.00 lakh, with a condition that the beneficiary should have own land for shed and fodder cultivation. This is also a employment generate scheme.

Starting a Bull station for production of Frozen Semen to meet the requirement of the Union Territory of Pondicherry.

**1. Name of the Scheme** : Livestock and Poultry Research and Training Centre.

**2. Objective of the Scheme** :

To render assistance to poultry farmers by providing inputs. To serve as a research and extension centre for pilot studies for operational procedures in livestock and poultry farming. To serve as a practical training centre for farmers in the field of animal husbandry and poultry, in order to equip them to take up livestock and poultry activities for additional income generation. Poultry farming being a remunerative enterprise for rural folk, it is proposed to supply chicks reared up to 8 weeks in the Government farms at subsidized cost to the farmers to encourage backyard farming. Rearing of birds for egg production in Government farms.

To generate employment opportunities in rural, semi urban and urban areas the following two new schemes have been proposed.

(i) Assistance to 100 beneficiaries (Unemployed youth and farmers) @ 75% subsidy under Broiler rearing scheme.

(ii) Assistance to 50 beneficiaries (Unemployed youth and farmers) @ 75% subsidy under Rabbit rearing scheme.

**1. Name of the Scheme :** Exchange of Ram/Bucks to grade up the sheep / goat population for better meat production.

**2. Objective of the Scheme :**

To promote the economic status of the economically backward women in the rural area by way of distribution of graded Buck/Ram for cross breeding of their local goat population and to upgrade their goats and ultimately to enhance the upgraded goat population and meat production.

**3.(a) Actual physical Achievement 2003-04 :**

605 graded bucks/rams were purchased & distributed to 605 women beneficiaries on exchange basis.

**(b) Anticipated Physical Achievement 2004 - 05 :**

- i) 875 bucks/rams to be purchased & distributed to rural women beneficiaries at free of cost from this year onwards (2004-05) instead of exchange basis.
- ii) 300 goat units will be purchased and distributed to the 300 below poverty line scheduled caste farmers at free of cost. Each goat unit consists of 4 female goats and one male goat
- iii) 1000 goat units will be purchased and distributed to 1000 poor women self help groups at 75% subsidized cost. Each goat unit consists of 5 female goats and one male goat.

- i) 1000 Graded bucks/rams will be purchased & distributed to 1000 women beneficiaries at free of cost.
- ii) 750 goat units (4 female goats and one male goat per unit ) will be purchased and distributed to 750 below poverty line scheduled caste farmers at free of cost.
- iii) 1200 goat units (5 female goats and one male goat per unit) will be purchased will be purchased and distributed to 1200 poor women self help groups at 75% subsidized cost.
- vi) 50 goat units (25 female goats and one male goat per unit) will be purchased and distributed to the previously experienced in goat rearing who are interested rural farmers at 75% subsidized cost.

- iii) Distribution of 5 female goats and one male goat to the poor women self help group members at 75% subsidized cost, is a new scheme for the year 2004-2005.
- vi) Distribution of 25 female goats and one male goat to the interested rural and experienced farmers at 75% subsidized cost, is a new scheme for the year 2005-2006.
