COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

During 2005-2006, it is proposed to take up 250 works under MLA's local area development programme, 10 works under composite scheme, 10 village Panchayat office building works, 6 works under integrated development of villages of religious importance, 25 improvement of burial/cremation ground works. 10 Commune Panchayats will be assisted to clear their current consumption charges bills by way of releasing grant to them.

Directorate of Rural Development through its programmes proposes to uplift the standard of living among the rural people and to bring forth-general awareness in the modern technology in the field of education etc. Colour TV sets are procured and supplied free of cost every year for the establishment of Community TV Centres with the objective to promote awareness through visual media in the field of Socio-economic, education, health, environment, entertainment etc. The Department maintains six farms at different places in Pondicherry and Karaikal regions. Nutritious fruits and vegetables are cultivated in the gardens and supplied to the Mahalir Mandrams, which run Balwadis and to the Aganwadis free of cost.

It is proposed to acquire land for construction of office building for Block Development Office at Ariankuppam. During 2005-06, it is proposed purchase and replace of 34 TV sets, purchase of 340 sports articles / musical instruments for free distribution to yuvak mandals / mahila mandals, maintenance and setting up of 36 rural development centre, maintenance of 6 ANP gardens, release of grant in aid to 225 mahila / yuvak mandals, issue of 167 cash awards to mahila / yuvak mandals, financial incentive awards to 1168 Self Help Group women members, grant of Special incentive awards to 16 best mahila / yuvak mandals. It is also proposed to take up construction of Multipurpose Community Halls / Recreation Centres and renovate / reconstruct VLW quarters.

Swarnajayanthi Swarozgar Yojana is a holistic Programme covering various aspects of self employment such as organisation of the poor into self Help groups, training, credit, technology, infrastructure and marketing. To assist poor families above the poverty line by providing them income-generating assets through a mix of bank credit and governmental subsidy. The scheme aims at establishing large number of micro enterprises in the rural areas building upon the potential of the rural poor. In the Annual Plan 2005-06, this scheme will be operated under State Plan also in order to meet the continuing demand.

DRDA has been implementing the central Sector scheme SGSY with effect from 1999-2000 in the U.T. The Successful implementation of the SGSY scheme in the U.T has led to the formation of 928 self-help groups in the U.T and there is increasing demand for Subsidy & Credit by the groups which DRDA is not in a position to meet with Central fund alone. Hence, it has been proposed to operate a separate scheme under State Plan.

1. Name of the Scheme : Total Sanitation Campaign Programme

2. Objective of the Scheme

Accelerating coverage of rural population by 25% by 2002, Generating felt need through awareness creation and health education, Governing schools in rural areas with sanitation facilities, Encouraging suitable cost effective and appropriate technologies. Consequently bringing about a reduction in the incidence of water and sanitation related diseases (as evidenced by fall in the infant/child mortality rate and incidence of diarrhea diseases.)

(b) Anticipated Physical Achievement 2004-05:

TSC is a Central Sector Scheme. The major components of the scheme are start up activities, Information Communication and Education activities, Construction of Women Sanitary

complex, School Sanitation, construction of Individual Household latrines. For the construction of Individual household latrines an amount Rs. 500/- is given under the scheme. However until 1999-2000, an amount of Rs.3080/- was given for construction of latrines from both CRSP and MNP funds. The scheme MNp has been closed and funds under the scheme are not available at present. Decrease in subsidy has slowed down the progress of construction of individual toilets.. Moreover, as per the project proposal beneficiary contribution has to be received from LAD for Community Toilet Complex (Rs. 9.24 lakhs), from Education Department for School Sanitation (Rs. 0.52 lakhs) and from Women and Child Development Department for Anganwadi toilets (Rs. 0.30 lakhs). the respective departments were addressed for beneficiary contribution and the same has not been received so far. Hence in order to provide an impulse to accelerate the progress in the construction of individual toilets and for getting beneficiary contribution from the State government it has been proposed to get matching grant of Rs. 30.06 lakhs for construction of 2000 latrines, 20 Community toilet complexes, 15 Anganwadi toilets and 13Urinal Blocks for boys/girls each during 2004-2005.

(c) Programme envisaged for Annual Plan 2005-06:

2000 individual household latrines will be constructed. 20 Community Toilet Blocks, 15 Anganwadi Toilets will be constructed
