

EDUCATION

(A) SCHOOL EDUCATION

Elementary Education & Literacy

Education plays a vital role in the economic, social and cultural development of a country. Besides moulding character and values of the citizen, the overall growth of the country depends on educational growth. Education is the basic prerequisite to build a just, equitable society and a tool for the development of the individual and the nation. The vision of the Administration is to offer quality education aiming at all round development from Primary to Higher Secondary level. In so far as the Union territory of Puducherry is concerned education has been placed at a higher pedestal.

Literacy

As per 2001 census, the literacy rate of Union Territory of Puducherry is 81.23% as against the National average of 65.38%. This Union Territory has been placed under category-IV having literacy rate of 75% and above and is in the 7th place in the ranking of literacy rate among all State/Union Territories. The task before this Union Territory is to achieve 100% literacy rate by 2012. In order to ensure universal access to primary education, the Pondicherry Compulsory Education Act 2000 was published on 24.10.2001. The following table shows region wise literacy rate.

There are totally 309 Primary schools and 112 Middle school (both Govt./Govt. aided and private schools). The enrolment in Primary schools has increased from 99495 in 2006-07 to 1,11,174 in 2007-08 and the enrolment in upper primary schools has increased from 61888 in 2006-07 to 69423 in 2007-08. As per National norms, 1 Primary school for 1 km radius

should be available. All the 437 habitations in the Union Territory are provided with access to Primary schools within 1 km distance. The dropout in Primary is Nil as per National survey. In Education development Index this U.T ranks second (2006-07) in Primary and Upper Primary schooling. The teacher pupil ratio is 1:27 (National norm is 1:32)

In order to achieve total literacy and to cover 1,00,000 neo-literates in the age group 14-45 in which women constitute major chunk, a new programme called Kamarajar Literacy Mission has been initiated in accordance with the observation made by the then President of India during his visit to Puducherry on 01.11.2004.

Secondary Education

There are 162 High Schools and 93 Higher Secondary Schools (both Govt / Govt – aided and private schools). In this Union Territory every student passing 10th Std is assured of a seat in the Hr. Sec. Classes. Every Higher Secondary school is provided with a lab of 20 computers and an LCD projector. To ensure retention and reduce dropout in secondary and Higher Secondary level, free supply of uniform, text books, note books, footwear, free Mid-day meals and Breakfast have been extended upto XII standard in Govt / Govt – aided schools. The DIET and the State Training centre take care of in-service training to Teachers. The total student strength in secondary and Higher secondary class is 66138. The salient feature is that the strength of girl student is 33889 as against the boys strength of 32849. Thus the girls strength is more than the boys strength at the Higher Secondary level.

Vocational Education

Vocationalisation of secondary education is a major objective of the reforms envisaged in the education policy adopted in 1986. The introduction of systematic and well planned programme of vocational education is crucial in the proposed educational re-organisation. Not only does vocational education offer meaningful alternative to general education but helps in increased productivity and the economy as well. The objectives of vocational education are as follows:-

- i) Development of vocational programme at all levels
- ii) Laying guidelines for vocational education
- iii) Development of Bridge / Transfer of Courses / Entrepreneurship counselling
- iv) To reduce the mismatch between demand and supply of skilled man power to provide diversification of educational opportunities
- v) To provide an alternative for those pursuing Higher Education.

ACHIEVEMENTS DURING 2007-08

- Under free supply of books, stationery, uniform, footwear etc 1,42,152 general students and 45,308 S.C. students were benefitted.
- Under OEBC scholarship scheme 17322 students were benefitted; and under incentive award to +2 students, 1601 students were benefitted.
- 34th Jawaharlal National Science Exhibition for children first of its kind was conducted in Puducherry.
- Under National Service Scheme and community service scheme 14520 students and 3000 students were enrolled respectively.
- Under training to Teachers 34 programmes benefiting 1020 teachers @ 30 teachers per programme was conducted by State Training Centre.
- Under SSA, the achievements include establishment of 6 Block Resource Centres, 23 Cluster Resource Centres, execution of 102 civil works, construction of 53 toilets / Drinking water facility, 350 students covered under intervention for out of school children, intervention for girls children 4 Districts & SC students 4 Districts , 2501 children under intervention for disabled children, 504 maintenance grants, 530 school grants, 4626 Teacher grants, 6456 remedial teaching etc.,
- 20 NTS awardees were paid Rs.5000/- each 11 schools were given Rs.1.00 lakhs cash award each for the best performance in Public examination.

LIKELY ACHIEVEMENTS FOR 2008-09

- Under free supply of books, stationery, uniform, footwear etc 1,41,718 general students and 42,379 S.C. students are expected to be benefitted.
- Under OEBC scholarship scheme 17800 students and under incentive award to +2 students, 2000 students will be benefitted.
- State level Science exhibition will be held in Yanam.
- Under National Service Scheme and community service scheme 15970 students and 3050 students will be enrolled respectively.
- Under training to Teachers 30 programmes benefiting 900 teachers @ 30 teachers per programme will be conducted by State Training Centre.
- Under SSA, the likely achievements include establishment of 6 Block Resource Centre, 25 Cluster Resource Centres, execution of 408 civil works, construction of 9 toilets / Drinking water facility, 892 students under intervention for out of school

children, intervention for girls children 4 Districts & SC students 4 Districts, 2983 children under intervention for disabled children, 498 maintenance grants, 578 school grants, 4864 Teacher grants, 7190 remedial teaching etc.,

- 20 NTS awardees will be paid Rs.5000/- each, 11 Govt. schools will be given Rs.1.00 lakh cash award each for scoring 100% result in Urban area and 90% result in rural area in SSLC / HSC Public examination.

SARVA SHIKSHA ABHIYAN

Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, the Universalisation of Elementary Education in a mission mode, was launched in Puducherry in 2003. The scheme aims to provide Quality Elementary Education for all children in the age group 6-14 by 2010 and to bridge the social, regional and gender gaps.

To initiate the community as the owners of Education system, a Village Education Committees in each school is formed involving members of the community.

The Village Education Committee (VEC) is entrusted with the responsibility to monitor and to spend the amount given by Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan to the schools by adhering to the usual procedure and norms.

The capacities of the teachers are updated by organizing series of training courses to the teachers; most of the teachers are trained around 5 to 7 days per year against the norm of 20 days. The 86th Constitutional Amendment Act 2002 makes Education a fundamental right for all children in the age group of 6-14 years. To ensure the fundamental right, mainstreaming of out of school children and children with special needs is the main target of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, which is achieved by adopting three strategies, enrolment drive, universalising physical access and strategies for other out of school children in Puducherry. The steps adopted for enrolling the out of school children are by opening alternative and innovative schools. One such school, which is successful, is the school opened at Narikuravur habitations which has enrolled 52 children, who would otherwise be out of school children. A residential bridge camp started at Yanam enrolling 106 students is also another intervention for tackling the problems of seasonal migrants.

Inclusive Education is a developmental approach seeking to address the learning needs of all children. It is a dynamic process to enable, enhance and strengthen the education systems

and methodologies to meet the needs of children with disabilities. Through various activities like identification, assessing, providing assistive device, mobilizing resource material, providing home based learning and financing for corrective surgeries this U.T Administration attempt to acknowledge that “Given an opportunity All children can Learn”.

Realizing the importance and impact of Pre Primary Education on Primary Education, the Government of Puducherry started Pre Primary classes in all Government Primary Schools. Puducherry is unique in having Pre Primary classes in all Government Primary Schools where specially trained Pre- Primary teachers are engaged under SSA for handling KG classes. To promote the girls’ enrolment in Puducherry, SSA has implemented vocational skill development programme in schools to empower girl children. Besides, a counseling programme for adolescent girls have been running successfully to overcome their stress and strain encountered in their adolescent period by engaging trained women teachers as counseling assistants.

Quality Initiative:

- i. The Activity Based Learning is introduced in al Tamil Medium Schools
- ii. The Active Learning Methodology has been introduced in all Upper Primary classes for the subject Science and Social Studies.
- iii. An innovative model of Computer Aided Learning is being evolved and introduced in 20 schools as a first step. If this model is successful, it will be introduced in all other schools. This model is being implemented along with the convergence of Azim Premji Foundation
- iv. An innovative model of teaching maths through Computer Aided Learning will be introduced in all Upper Primary Sections in the year 2009 – 2010.

PROPOSED TARGETS FOR 2009-10

- 1,46,007 general students and 42317 S.C students are expected to be benefitted under the scheme free supply of books, stationery, uniform, footwear etc.,
- Under OEBC scholarship schemes 18500 students will be benefitted
- Under incentive award to +2 students, 3300 students will be benefitted
- 6 pre – primary schools will be opened in Yanam Region

- 4 High Schools viz. GGHS, Kalapet, GHS, PS Palayam, GHS, Murungapakkam and Tamil Tendral Thiru Vi. Ka. GHS, Puducherry will be upgraded in to Higher Secondary Schools.
- Rs. 1.00 lakhs cash award for scoring 100 % result in urban areas and 90% in rural areas in the SSLC & +2 Public examination will be given to 20 schools.
- 169 Schools will be covered under ICT @ School Programme
- Land will be acquired for construction of building for Kendriya Vidyalaya, Karaikal & Mahe and for various schools / play grounds.
- Construction of Central Kitchen at Kuruvinatham, K.T. Kuppam in Puducherry region and Sethur and Anna Nagar in Karaikal region.

SPORTS AND YOUTH SERVICES

There is a separate of wing for development of sports and youth services in the school education department. Various sport development activities for better performance of the students in schools are being implemented by this wing. The main objective of this sports wing is to develop the physical health of the students by way of conducting Annual Sports day, distribution of prizes medals, cash awards, certificates etc.

For the development of sports the infrastructure available includes Indira Gandhi Stadium Complex at Uppalam with facilities like Astro - turf Hockey field, Tennis play Court, Cricket training pitch, Volley ball court, Hand ball court, Kho-Kho & Kabaddi courts and Rajiv Gandhi Indoor Stadium. The important activities are organisation of Zonal level school games (8 Zones), Coaching camps prior to state school games, 15 days specialized training prior to participation in State School Games, State School Games Championship Programme, Participation in National School Games Championship, State level Children's rally, Independence Day / Republic Day parade arrangements and cultural programme, Coaching programme for selected students to participate in National Competitions.

Pondicherry State Sports Council

An autonomous body for the development of sports activities among the youth. The State Sports Associations are recognized by the Pondicherry State Sports Council. The Sports council is funded by the Govt. by way of Grant-in-aid every year to carry out its

functions. 23 number of Association have been recognized. Funding for National and Zonal Championship participation and cash award to winners of international and National level sports events.

RAJIV GANDHI SCHOOL OF SPORTS

An autonomous institution fully funded by Government. 100 young students (6th to 12th) having special sports skill are selected and accommodated in the Rajiv Gandhi School of Sports and continue to get the special coaching in the games like Football, Hockey, Volleyball, Athletic and Badminton. The students pursue their studies in the urban area schools. Nutrition food at Rs.80/- per day per student is spent. This School prepare the students for participation in National competitions. 15 acres of land has been allotted in Kalapet revenue village for the construction of building for Rajiv Gandhi School of Sports.

STRATEGIES PROPOSED AND POLICY FOCUS DURING 2009-10.

To improve quality and standard of Education and further improvement in literacy rate, strengthening of computer education, provision of required infrastructure like additional classrooms, toilet, drinking water supply, benches / desks etc., to create congenial atmosphere will be the main strategy. Land will be acquired for construction of pucca building for schools running in rented building. In view of the financial contingency to meet the urgent requirement of infrastructure facilities, financial assistance from NABARD under RIDF – XIV loan scheme are being explored. To improve sports activities and ensure effective administration and monitoring of development of sports, a separate Directorate of Sports will be set up. To encourage and develop sports in rural areas lands will be acquired to set up playground/mini stadium. Grant-in-aid will be released at enhanced level to Puducherry State Sports Council and Rajiv Gandhi School of Sports to meet committed expenditure and to undertake more no. of sports and Youth activities.

Education is the critical factor that will empower the poor to participate in the growth process. To ensure a continuous and growing supply of quality manpower, we need large investments in public sector institution of **higher learning** combined with fundamental **reforms of curriculum**.

PERFORMANCE DURING 2007-08

- An Engineering College was started at Karaikal from the academic year 2007-08 with three B.Tech courses
- Construction of new building for Indira Gandhi Polytechnic, Mahe
- Kanchimamunivar Center for Post-Graduate Studies, Puducherry has been conferred with Autonomous Status by University Grants Commission
- Starting of B.Sc. (Physics) course in Dr. SRK Govt. Arts College, Yanam during 2007-08.
- Network facilities has been provided in the entire campus of Pondicherry Engineering College.
- Internet Broad band facility extended to all Govt. Colleges to improve their academic performances.
- Quality Assurance Cell, Training and Placement Cell, Career Guidance, Counseling Centre and Alumini Association were started in Karaikal Polytechnic & Women's Polytechnic.
- Canada India Institutional Co-operation Project was started in Karaikal Polytechnic, Karaikal
- Under Perunthalaivar Kamarajar Financial Assistance Scheme, 523 Medical students, 36 BDS Students, 1990 Engineering, MCA/MBA students, 236 B.Ed. Students, 1657 D.T.Ed students and 39 MHRD students were benefited.

STRATEGIES PROPOSED AND POLICY FOCUSED DURING 2009-10

There is clearly a need to undertake major expansions and improve quality. For this, new colleges and Universities must be set up to provide easier access to students in educationally backward districts. Existing institutions must be strengthened and expanded, along with open and distance education modes. Hence, it is planned to setup the Puducherry State University, which would provide extended higher educational facilities especially to the students from middle and lower income groups and backward and underprivileged sections of people. To increase employability and jobs seeking capacity, a Community College with job oriented courses will be set up in Karaikal. Expanded programmes of higher and research education will be planned in different regions to reduce regional imbalances and to reduce backwardness.

The skills and competence of the students will be focused so that they could become employable anywhere in India. Entrepreneurial Development courses, Add on Courses, and new Vocational Courses are planned. Private and Public Sector participation would be encouraged in setting up premier institutions of Information Technology and Management. Action is being taken to set up Task Force Committee to start National Level Institutions like IIM, IIIT.

Efforts is being taken to provide for infrastructural facilities in the form of latest books, use of more computer, internet and EDUSAT services and creation of resource centers for various disciplines / departments. In order to augment these facilities, electronically content and testing mechanism would also be utilised by developing suitable materials.

(C) *LAW EDUCATION*

It is proposed to start a 3 year full time LLB course for degree holders, another branch in LLM and Post Graduate Diploma Course.

(D) ART AND CULTURE

The Union Territory of Puducherry, the erstwhile French colony has many legacies of art & culture with a rich heritage. Romain Rolland Library, Public Branch Libraries (80 Nos.), Bharathiar, Bharathidasan, Subbaiah, Toy, French, Kizhour and Puducherry Museums and autonomous institutions like Bharathiar Palkalaikoodam and Pondicherry Institute of Linguistics Centre come under the Art & Culture sector.

PERFORMANCE DURING 2007-08

- Conferment of Awards for the meritorious persons in different fields such as Tamil Mamani Award, Malayala Ratna Award, Telugu Ratna Award, Puduvai Kalai Mamani Awards, Ilaighar Mamani Award, Nehru Children's Literary Award, Tholgappier Award, Kamban Pugazh Literary Awards.
- Conducted various vizhas/functions like Tamil Oli Vizha, Puduvai Sivam Vizha, Vanidhasan Vizha, Tamil Isai Vizha, Floating of tableaux in the Republic Day.

- Celebration and publication of Special volume of Annanda Ranga Pillai dairy on occasion of 3rd Century Birth Anniversary. Enrolment seminar will be conducted (12th Session) and World Tamizh poem will be printed. 15th and 16th volume of PJDS Journal will be printed. About Rs.1.00 crore is need in the year 2009-10 Outlay for the construction of Own building for PILC.

STRATEGY PROPOSED AND POLICY FOCUSED DURING 2009-10

- To establish State Level Hi-Tech library with all modern facilities at Puducherry and digitization of Branch libraries to encourage the literary and reading habits among the general public and students. Purchase of computers will be done in a phased manner and supplied to all Public and Branch libraries.
- Action on hand to computerize the public and Branch Libraries and also digitize rare and old documents available in the Romain Rolland Library and various museums.
- Establishment of “Children Learning Park” in Romain Rolland Library and other public libraries so as to make the libraries more children friendly.

- Starting of Medium Level Public Libraries (Commune Headquarters) in six places viz. Kadirgamam, Villianur, Bahour, Thirukkanur, Nettapakkam and Nedungadu (Karaikal). Action being taken to arrange accommodation and to get administrative approval.
- Historic, Memorial and Scientific Museum will be established at Karaikal. Acquisition of land adjacent to Kizhoor historical monument for development and beautification of the monument so as to make it as a tourist spot, with a children amusement park.
