#### OTHER ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

### (A) FIRE SERVICE

To modernize the fire service activities in order to cope up with the present trend. Strengthening the fire stations by creating various technical posts.

#### **ACHIEVEMENTS DURING 2008-09:**

- ➤ 956 nos. of fire calls were attended in the UT of Puducherry.
- ➤ Rs.5.02 crore values of properties were saved.
- > 11 nos. of major fire calls attended
- ➤ 26 peoples were rescued

- Formation of specialized Disaster Mitigation Crew.
- Formation of modernized control room with digital mapping system.

# (B) ACCOUNTS AND TREASURIES

It is proposed to upgrade the post of Director of Accounts & Treasuries as Controller of Accounts in the XI Five Year Plan on par with NCT of Delhi.

Further, consequent upon the notification of the Government of Pondicherry (Custody of Public Money) Rules, 2006 with effect from 10.05.2006, the Union

Territory Government is empowered to raise Public Debts and issue Guarantees to maintain a separate Public Account for the Union Territory of Puducherry. Further, the Union Territory has to maintain a separate minimum cash balance with Reserve Bank of India. Since so far, the Union Territory of Puducherry did not have a separate Public Account and the Public Account of this Union Territory is merged with the Public Account of Government of India, the need to watch the cash balance on day-to-day basis has not arisen. Having notified amendments to the Union Territory Act and constituted a separate Public Account for the Union Territory of Puducherry, the cash balance have to be watched on day to day basis for which a Current Account section has to be created in the DAT with one Deputy Director and complimentary staff. To monitor and control the expenditure and to correspond with Heads of Departments and with the Reserve Bank Authorities, a separate cell need to function at Finance Department with an Officer in the appropriate level to function as Director of Ways and Means.

### LIKELY ACHIEVEMENTS 2009-10:

➤ Maintenance of existing schemes, posts, Computers and Printers and purchase of additional computers, printers, etc.

### PROPOSED TARGETS FOR 2010-11:

- Maintenance of existing schemes, posts, Computers and Printers.
- Creation Of Posts For Strengthening The Activities Of Directorate Of Accounts And Treasuries

Acquisition of land and Construction of Additional Block for this Directorate

> It is proposed to construct additional block of the Directorate of Accounts and Treasuries, as the existing accommodation itself is very congested.

### (C) COMMERCIAL TAXES

The Government of India proposed to introduce Goods and Service Tax w.e.f. 1st April 2010 replacing Puducherry Value Added Tax Act 2007. In the proposed GST Act this administration will be having power to levy GST on all the services hitherto levied by the Central Government. The rate of Tax and incidence of levy will be known only during January 2010.

### (D) POLICE

To modernize the Police Force in the UT of Puducherry, SIGMA Security / Intellignce Cell, Bomb Detective / Disposal Squad were set up. Marine and Coastal Security wing has also been set up. To implement e-Governance scheme in the Police Department, computerization of all Police Stations and Offices are being done by Crime Records Bureau. To strengthen the communication system, implementation of POLNET project and secrecy device system is in progress.

### **ACHIEVEMENTS DURING 2008-09:**

- > Payment of salaries for the existing Plan posts.
- > Purchase of computers consumables, upgradation of computers, replacement of computer spares, AMC charges for computers, etc.
- > Purchase of Pistol 9 mm (20 nos.), Carbine 9 mm (20 nos.), Cartridges 9 mm (5000 nos.) and tear smoke munitions.

#### LIKELY ACHIEVEMENTS 2009-10:

- ➤ Purchase of Traffic sign boards, P.A. system, reflective jacket and gloves, iron barricading, furniture, Photo copier papers & other non stationary items, toner & consumables, Digital copier machines, H.P. Laser multifunctional printers, LCD Projectors, High Resolution Scanners, Terminal Printers, Colour Photocopier machines, Photo materials, Fax machines, Cooking vessels, Refrigerators, Television, DVDs, etc.,
- > Purchase of clothing and equipments for Police personnel.
- ➤ Purchase of Pistol Browning 9 mm (20 nos.), Carbine 9 mm (20 nos.), Cartridges 9 mm (10000 nos.) and Tear smoke munitions.
- > Purchase of Photo materials, misc. items, etc.
- ➤ Purchase of vehicles for newly created posts Motor cycle (38 nos.), Ambulance (2 nos.), Bus (2 nos.), Maruthi Gypsy (8 nos.) and Mini Bus (5 nos.).
- ➤ Purchase of Video Detector, Portable Video Jammer, Electronic monitoring spy phone, Pen camera, Bomb disposal equipment, Lie Detector, Digital Voice Recorder, Digital Video Recorder, Digital Hidden Camera, 360 degree Camera, Digital movie camera, Forensic Light Source, Live Finger Print Scanner, Finger Print kit box, etc.

- Acquisition of lands for Villianur Traffic Police Station & Staff quarters, Police Complex at Oduthurai, Karaikal, Border Check Posts at Gorimedu, Ariyur, Embalam, Saram and Allankuppam O.Ps., Coastal Police Station at Mahe, Look Out Posts at Karaikal (3 nos.), Traffic Police Station at Puducherry & Kirumampakkam, Police Outpost at Chalakara (Mahe), All Women Police Station at Mahe, Police Outpost at Darialatippa (Yanam) and Barracks for IRBn at Yanam.
- ➤ Purchase of new computers with accessories. Repairs and replacement of computers/printers spares for 128 nos + 164 (including CIPA project computer with printers), Purchase of Computer consumables for 292 nos. (including CIPA project computer with printers), AMC charges for computers, etc.
- Creation of necessary posts.

### PROPOSED TARGETS FOR 2010-11:

- ➤ Purchase of 18 nos. of computers with accessories, Lazer Jet Printer 9 nos. Colour Lazer Printer, purchase of tonners, computers consumables, replacement of computer spares, AMC charges for computers, etc.
- ➤ Purchase of Sub-Machine Carbine 9 mm (20 nos.), Cartridges 9 mm (10,000 nos.) and tear smoke munitions (200 nos.).

# (E) REVENUE

Computerization of certificate issue process was introduced in Taluk Office, which makes speedy disposal of cases and storage of data for further retrieval and scrutiny. A scheme for issue of Permanent caste Certificate to the Scheduled Caste and Other Backward Class was implemented on pilot basis in one Taluk, by which caste certificate with digitally captured image of the applicant with fully laminated ones are issued to the general public. Now, in lieu of Permanent Caste Certificate, Permanent Integrated Certificate comprising Nationality, Nativity/Residence, Income and Caste Certificate is being issued to the students studying in 9th to 12th Std., of this U.T

Earlier a scheme for grant of Financial assistance of Rs.20,000/- 25,000/- and Rs.50,000/- under Jana Shree Bhima Yojana Scheme through L.I.C was

implemented with effect from 5-2-2004 by which members of BPL families benefited in the event of unnatural and natural death, permanent and partial disability or death by accident of any of the family members.

This scheme was replaced by <u>Rajiv Gandhi Social Security Scheme</u> for poor families with effect from 5-2-2005 and implemented directly through the Department of Revenue and Disaster Management by which Members of BPL families are benefited in the event of natural death, partial disability, permanent disability or accidental death of the family to a tune of Rs.25, 000/- and 50,000/- alongwith a scholarship Scheme for the dependent children of all BPL families. In the wake of various private financial institutions cheating public, their hard earned money, a new legislation viz. "Puducherry Protection of Interests of Depositors in Financial Establishments Act 2005" was introduced and to meet the statutory requirements of this Act, 7 posts were created. Subsequent to the creation of new District, District Collector, Puducherry and District Collector, Karaikal have now been designated as District Election Officers under Election Laws, hence separate Election Cell is proposed to be created with sufficient posts to man the Election Cell both in Puducherry and Karaikal Districts.

# **Disaster Management**

After the occurrence of the December 2004 Tsunami the Government of Puducherry have undertaken a number initiatives in Disaster Management based on the guidance received from National Disaster Management Authority and Ministry of Home Affairs, New Delhi. The Disaster Management Act, 2005 was made applicable in the UT of Puducherry w.e.f 01.08.07. In consonance with the provisions of the Disaster Management Act, Government of Puducherry have constituted the following Authorities/committee for mitigation and management of Disasters.

# a) U.T. of Puducherry Disaster Management Authority

State Disaster Management Authority as envisaged in section 14 of Disaster Management Act. The Chief Minister is the Chairman of the Authority. The rules for terms and condition of member of U.T. of Puducherry Disaster Management Authority have been notified.

# b) State Executive Committee

Pursuant to Section 20 of Disaster Management Act, 2005, the Chief Secretary to Government is the Chairman of the Committee. The rules for the functioning of the Committee have been notified.

# c) District Disaster Management Authority

District Disaster Management Authority for Puducherry and Karaikal district notified under the Chairmanship of the District Collectors concerned.

The Disaster Management Act, 2005 provided for establishing of following funds for the purposes of the Act (Section 48). In order to functionalize the above said authorities, funds are required. The details are as follows.

# Modernization of Registration Department

Registration Department is being computerized and it has taken up Computerization of Registration process christened as "e-Pathiram" with the assistance of NIC, Puducherry. Presently workflow module of e-Patharam is implemented in all Sub-Registries. The manual filing sheet system has since been

dispensed with on the implementation of this module. The document will be scanned and stored in electronic media for future retrieval.

# Mitigation and Relief Fund under Disaster Management

Disaster Management Act, 2005 have been brought into force with effect from 01.08.2007 in all the States/UTs including Puducherry Union Territory. The statutory requirements such as the State Disaster Management Authority, District Disaster Management Authorities and State Executive Committee have already been constituted. As per the provisions of Disaster Management Act, 2005, basically there are two types of fund namely "Response Fund" and "Mitigation Fund" at both District and State level which are to be constituted. Regarding the immediate relief on occurrence of any calamity, the U.T. administration is following CRF norms/guidelines issued by the Ministry of Home Affairs, New Delhi. During natural calamities, relief assistance is to be extended to the affected and for such preventive rescue and relief measures sufficient funds are to be provided.

# (F) OFFICE OF THE COUNCIL OF MINISTER

As, the function of the Council of Ministers under various portfolios are multifarious and it goes on, the present staff position is not sufficient to bear with the work load entrusted to them. Hence, the Post of Secretary to Chief Minister and Private Secretary to Chief Minister and Ministers were created/upgraded after getting approval of the Administrative Secretary and their pay and allowances are met from the above said Plan Head.

# (G) HINDU RELIGIOUS INSTITUTIONS

In the Union Territory of Puducherry, there are many temples situated in the A.D. colony/economically weaker section areas, which are not coming under direct control of HRI. Considering the prayer of the local residents/devotees, the Government extends financial assistance as one time grant for attending the renovation/special repair works to those temples. The quantum of financial assistance released to a temple is Rs.2,00,000/- (in two instalments).

#### **ACHIEVEMENTS DURING 2008-09:**

- ➤ Financial assistance to the tune of Rs.22,93,000/- was given to 23 temples in the Union Territory of Puducherry situated in Adi-Dravidar Colony areas and economically weaker section areas.
- ➤ Financial assistance to the tune of Rs.8,85,000/- was released to 59 temples, coming under low-income group for the performance of one time pooja, under the scheme "ORU KALA POOJA SCHEME", besides payment of Current and Water consumption charges.

### LIKELY ACHIEVEMENT DURING 2009-10:

- ➤ To release financial assistance to 45 temples situated in the A.D. colonies/economically weaker section areas of the Union Territory of Puducherry to carry out renovation/special repair works to the temples at a cost of Rs.45.00 lakhs. Also proposed to enhance the quantum of assistance under the scheme from Rs.2 lakhs to Rs.2.5 lakhs.
- ➤ To sanction financial assistance at the rate of Rs.15,000/- per annum to ensure performance of at least One Time Pooja in respect of 40 temples newly entering "ORU KALA POOJA SCHEME". Besides financial assistance is also to be extended to meet out current consumption charges @ Rs.1,000/- and water consumption charges @ Rs.500/-per annum to the eligible temples. It is also proposed to enhance the assistance under the scheme from Rs.15,000/- to Rs.20,000/-

#### PROPOSED TARGETS FOR 2010-11:

- ➤ Grant financial assistance to 50 number of temples @ Rs.1,00,000/-located in the economically weaker section areas/A.D. Colonies for carrying out renovation and repair works.
- ➤ Grant of assistance under Oru Kala Pooja Scheme to 40 temples @ Rs.15,000/- besides extending assistance for payment of current/water consumption charges.
- ➤ Grant assistance to nearly 50 temple employees @ of Rs.500/- per month, under the new scheme "Assistance to retiring temple employees".
- > Setting up of branch office at Karaikal.
- Create an Internal Audit Wing.

- Create new posts for Office of the Commissioner (HRI)
- > Purchase land and construct office building for HRI.
- ➤ Purchase software along with 3 new computer systems with requisite configurations to keep updated the automation works of this office.

# (H) PERSONNEL & ADMINISTRATIVE REFORMS WING

To familiarize the Government officials/staff on latest rules and regulations, the Administrative Reforms wing is organizing training programmes to various categories of Government Staff. Workshops and seminars are also being organized to improve the efficiency of Government staff and for better utilization of manpower.

# (I) JAIL

To improve the functioning of Prisons, new posts are proposed to be created. According to the Model Prison Manual modernization of Prisons have to be continued by providing more number of equipment related to security, hospital and workshop. Construction of Phase II is essential for providing essential infrastructural facilities in the Central Prison as per norms. Similarly modernization has to be carried out further to improve Prison Security and provide medical care and opportunities for learning to prisoners with a view to enable them to lead normal life after completion of sentence. Prison official have also to be trained to handle the prison duties effectively.

# (J) LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY SECRETARIAT

This Assembly Secretariat is expected to cater to the multifarious requirements of the MLAs with a view to rendering them timely assistance in the discharge of the Parliamentary functions. The Officers and staff are entrusted with duties to serve the House, Speaker, Deputy Speaker and MLAs. With the existing staff strength, the Secretariat is facing many difficulties to cater to the needs of members and in the Committee activities. For more than two decades, no post was created in this Secretariat. To cope up the increasing work load and to provide adequate security to the Legislative Assembly, this Secretariat felt to create necessary posts for smooth functioning of Legislative Assembly. To strengthen the Legislative Assembly Secretariat by creation of new posts and for modernization of Legislative Assembly Secretariat in the wings of Library and Security etc.

# (K) LAW

It is proposed to strengthen the Law Department by purchasing with the latest technology like computerisation and office equipments.

# (L) JUDICIAL

To develop infrastructural facilities to the Judiciary and to strengthen the Courts with the latest Technology like computerization, Video Conferencing, setting up of server room and VSAT facility.
