FISHERIES

Union Territory of Puducherry comprises with region has a coastal line of 45 kms, 1000 sq.km of continental shelves enriched with marine fisheries potential. It has a fishermen population of about 95,467 of which 29,383 nos. of fishermen are actively engaged in fishing from 27 marine fishing villages and 23 inland fishing villages/hamlets scattered in and around Union Territory. This Union Territory is also endowed with 1400 Ha of fresh water area in the form of ponds and tanks suitable for both capture and culture fishery. 800 Ha of Brackishwater area are available for undertaking Brackish water Prawn culture.

Fishery Sector has become a vital sector enriched with a source of livelihood for generating employment to a large extent of the society as well as sharing for national food security and valuable foreign exchange earnings. Under marine sector, coastal fisheries in many parts of the country having reached a saturation level, unexploited potential which lies in the deep sea has to be tapped up by adopting diversified method of fishing, by implementation of code of conduct for responsible fishery (CCRF), observance of closed season in the east & west coast etc., It is imperative to modernize the sector with diversified method of fishing with various new components related to exploitation of deep sea oceanic fishery resources, sea safety measures, insuring of fishing fleets etc., to ensure availability of fish in prime condition to the consumers and fishing industry. Sea weed culture, Mud crab fattening is also proposed to be taken up. Introduction of Artificial Reef for improving livelihood security of Fishermen by resource enhancement.

Various development & welfare oriented schemes are implemented with the objectives of augmenting marine, freshwater and brackishwater fishery production and also for uplifting the socio-economic status of the fisherfolk with due focus on safeguarding the interest of all sectors of fisher folk and for conserving the Marine, Inland and Brackish Water resources on sustainable basis. Special thrust have been focused to accomplish above goals through successive plan periods. As a result of it, the socio-economic status of the fishermen have developed considerably. After tsunami, more concentration has been given to alternate livelihood in order to accentuate their standard of living and also to create an awareness on and adaption to climate change. Strengthening of coastal security, online registration of fishing vessels and issue of

biometric identity cards to fisherfolk are some of the other important programmes to be taken up for implementation.

ACHIEVEMENTS DURING 2009-10

- The marine and inland fish Production was 36100 MT and 5850 MT respectively.
- Input subsidy amounting to ₹13.52 lakhs was granted to fresh water fish farmers @
 ₹5000 per acre covering 270.4 acres.
- > 75 of people were assisted with 50% subsidy for purchase of Aquarium Tank with its accessories, amounting to ₹1.50 lakhs.
- 24 ha of Brackishwater fish farm at Yanam were granted with Construction subsidy @
 ₹45,000/ha and Input subsidy @ ₹15,000/ha.

- > 3 boat owners were assisted with ₹ 0.48 lakh as 50% subsidy on the annual premium paid by them to their Mechanized boats.
- 9 fishermen were granted with 50% subsidy for purchase of Mini Truck amounting to ₹13,50,000/-; 2 fishermen were granted with 50% subsidy for purchase of Auto/Auto Goods Carrier amounting to ₹1,50,000/-; 1 fisherman is granted with 50% subsidy for purchase of Insulated Fish Van amounting to ₹5,00,000/-.
- Short Term Training was imparted to 100 fisherwomen on ornamental fish breeding and keeping, value added fishery products, sea weed culture, crab fattening etc.,
- ➤ ₹76 lakhs worth of fishery requisites were sold to fishermen at subsidized cost.
- > 50% Fair price shop subsidy @ ₹40,000 each was granted to 5 nos. Fishermen cooperative societies amounting to ₹2,00,000/-.

- ➤ Relief assistance was extended to 19,699 fishermen families @ 100 Kgs of rice and ₹750/- each during the period of ban on fishing.
- > 6028 aged fisherfolks were granted with Old Age Pension @ ₹750/- per month.
- ≥ 281 meritorious fishermen students who have studied in 10th and 12th standards were awarded with cash prize amounting to ₹10.29 lakhs.
- ➤ Financial assistance to a tune of ₹84.70 lakhs were granted to fisherfolk for loss of Crafts & Tackles and also for loss of life.

LIKELY ACHIEVEMENTS DURING 2010-11

- The marine and inland fish production will be augmented to 39,000 MT and 5950 MT respectively.
- Input subsidy @ ₹5000/- per acre for 300 acres.

- For Grant of input subsidy @ ₹ 5000/- per acre to cover 300 acres of freshwater area, besides extending aquarium tank subsidies to general public to a maximum of ₹ 3500/-.
- For Grant of construction subsidy @ ₹45,000/ha and input subsidy @ ₹15,000/ha to 10 ha of Brackishwater fish farm.
- ➤ 50% subsidy will be granted for purchase of 25 Steel boats, 5 Wooden boats, 60 FRP catamaran, 250 Inland Wooden Cattamaran, 5 FRP Vallam, 25 FRP boats, 25 Beach landing crafts and 25 FRP Nava with nets.
- Frant of 50% subsidy to a maximum of ₹2.50 lakhs for Modernization/Conversion of existing mechanized fishing boats and to a maximum of ₹1.00 lakh for strengthening of existing FRP Mechanised Boats to 20 beneficiaries.
- ➤ Reactivation charges @ ₹20,000/- and ₹10,000/- for 350 nos. of Wooden Mechanised Boats/ Steel Boats and FRP boats respectively, due to ban on fishing.

- Fishermen/fisherwomen co-operative societies, besides release of Grant-in-aid to Pondicherry State Fishermen Co-operative Federation, Fish Farmers Development Agency and Fishing Harbour Management Society.
- ➤ ₹90.00 lakhs worth of Fishery requisites at subsidized cost will be distributed to fishermen through fishermen co-operatives.
- ≥ 22,000 fishermen families will be assisted with ₹200/- cash and free clothing during lean season besides distribution of ₹2750 as cash per family during ban period.
- Cash awards to 300 meritorious fishermen students and Financial assistance to fishermen students admitted in professional courses through CENTAC.
- > 7,000 Old aged fisherfolk will be granted with Old Age Pension @ ₹750/- per month.
- Frant of Immediate Relief @ ₹2,00,000/- to the families of deceased fishermen in the event of his accidental death, Financial assistance @ ₹1,00,000/- to the families of Missing fishermen, while fishing in sea and ₹3,000 to families of deceased old age pensioners to meet out their funeral expenses.
- Conduct of study tour and training Programmes to fishermen/fisherwomen and Celebration of World Fisheries Day.
- Setting up of Puducherry Fisheries and Fishermen's Development Corporation and Oceanarium and also Establishment of Residential Schools for fishermen children in the U.T. of Puducherry.
- Provision of funds to meet out the balance cost for construction of Mahe fishing Harbour.
- Frant of subsidy assistance to fishermen/fisherwomen/SHG to carry out alternative livelihood practices like cage culture, pen culture, etc. and also for establishment of Aqua shops.
