LABOUR AND LABOUR WELFARE

The primary objective is to ensure industrial peace for better relationship between employees and employers and for protecting the rights and interests of the working class. The department also ensures social security to the workers in the organized and unorganized sectors for a decent standard of living.

It also provides conciliation services to prevent and settle industrial disputes, quasijudicial services, ensure industrial safety and health of the workers. The department also effectively enforces the provisions of Labour laws which includes central legislations and state legislations.

The Inspectorate of Factories and Boilers ensures the compliance of safety provisions of Factories Act, 1948, and Indian Boilers Act.1980. There are 1950 factories registered under the Factories Act 1948. The workers are periodically medically examined. Workers are given safety training and all the industries are inspected annually.

The department through the Employment and Training Wing, equips the youth with skills in Engineering and Non-Engineering trades in nine ITIs, to enhance their capacity and provide them with the opportunity to secure employment and address the skill gap in the secondary and tertiary sectors. A Centre for Excellence in Plastic Processing Sector has been established at Govt. ITI (M), Mettupalayam to impart skills in Plastic Sector. The Govt. ITI (M), Karaikal has been taken up for upgradation as Centre for Excellence under Vocational Training Improvement Programme with World Bank Assistance.

To improve the quality of Vocational Training and make it demand driven so as to ensure better employment of trained graduates, four ITIs, viz., Govt. ITI (W), Puducherry, Govt. ITI (W), Karaikal, Govt. ITI, Nettapakkam and Netaji Subash Chandra Bose Govt. ITI, Yanam, have been taken up for upgradation in association with an industry partner under the scheme, "Upgradation of 1396 Govt. ITIs through Public Private Partnership.

To impart effective and need based training to the Differently-Abled candidates by setting up of a Vocational Training centre, physically challenged persons are being trained in Data entry Operator and Book binding. 1,350 Training places have been located 600 apprentices are engaged in various industries. Under Apprenticeship Act, 280 Establishments and 14 Trades are covered.

State Level Vigilance Committee and Regional Vigilance committees for all the four regions have been constituted under the Bonded Labour (System) Abolition Act, 1976.

As per the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court on elimination of Child Labour, the Child Labour Rehabilitation-cum-Welfare Society has been established in the Union territory and a separate cell has been constituted in the Labour Department to combat the prevalence of Child Labour in hazardous Industries and to regulate their working conditions in non-hazardous occupations. Recent notification of Government of India banning child Labour in domestic employment, hotels, dhabhas, etc., is being enforced vigorously.

2. Objective of the Scheme

The objective of the scheme is for effective implementation of Labour Acts/rules. The Acts provide for settlement of Industrial disputes through the process of conciliation, enforcement of minimum wages and hours of work, ensuring safety and security to Industrial workers by way of conducting inspection of hazardous industries, conduct of safety training and safety seminars, celebration of national safety week to create awareness, conduct Medical examination to workers employed in hazardous and chemical industries, testing of pressure vessels, grant and renewal of factory license, approval of factory plans etc. The scheme also provides for imparting training to women in trades like embroidery, cutting, tailoring, needle work and doll making etc., Children of rural women labourers are provided noon meals through Rural Labour Welfare Centre. Eradication of child Labour is also an important objective of the Scheme.
