MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH

HEALTH & FAMILY WELFARE

The Health Care system is being implemented in the Union Territory of Puducherry through various Schemes under Health Sector with a view to provide preventive and curative health care by health protection, promotion and rehabilitation.

The Health Care in the Union Territory of Puducherry has been delivered through a network of 8 major Hospital, 4 CHCs 39 PHCs, 81 Sub-Centres, 14 ESI Dispensaries, 1 Physical Medicine Rehabilitation Centre and 17 Disease Specific Clinics for a population of 12,47,953. Annually over 57 lakhs out patients and over 1.40 lakhs in-patients are treated in these 164 health care centres/Institutions.

The Bed population ratio is 1: 252, Doctor population ratio is 1:961, Nurse population ratio is 1:1030 and Doctor Nurse ratio is 1: 2. The average population covered by Sub-Centres are 5365 as against the National norms of 5000, average population covered by PHCs are 19235 as against the National norms of 30,000 and average population covered by CHCs are 81,000 as against the National norms of 1,20,000. The per-capita Health expenditure for the UT of Puducherry is ₹3,130/- (excluding sanitation and water). Puducherry stands No.1 in UT's life expectancy which is 72.4 when compared to All India life expectancy of 65.

Important Health Programme implemented in UT:

Family Welfare Programme:

The overall health indicators in Puducherry have been far progressive when compared with the national indicators. The U.T. of Puducherry has been able to achieve the **Infant Mortality rate of 17** against national goal of 42. Since more than 99 % deliveries are conducted in the health institutions, it has been able to achieve the lowest **Maternal Mortality Rate of 36** against the national target of less than **200 / 1 lakh live births**. Out of the total deliveries of 39,875 cases, 39856 are institutional deliveries and only 19 are home deliveries. **Total Fertility Rate of 1.6** is the lowest in India against national goal of **2.59**. Due to the strict implementation of the PNDT Act in the UT and close monitoring of the sex ratio of children, it is possible to achieve SEX RATIO(0-6 years) of **967** (female to male children / 1000) which sufficed the goal set by the Government of India.

Blindness Control Programme

Under the National Programme for Control of Blindness, cataract operations are performed and IOL implantation being done to the patients. School children are also screened for refractive errors and free spectacles are provided to them. Due to the continued effort of the Health officials has helped the Health Department to reduce the incidence of blindness from 0.46 % to 0.40 % during the Eleventh Five Year Plan period. The percentage of IOL implantation under National Programme for Control of Blindness is 99.50 % and 15102 cataract surgeries were performed in the year 2013-14 against the target of 7,400.

Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme:

Due to the persistent efforts of the Health Department, cure rate improved year by year. It has been able to achieve 85 % in 2012 from 69 % in 2004. Simultaneously the case detection rate was always maintained above 70 %. Case detection rate for the year 2013 is 73.09 %. Moreover the **defaulter rate** (i.e. discontinuing the treatment before the completion) of newly detected infectious cases **has come down from 16 % to 4 %,** which is well within the recommended rate of less than 5 % - an important indicator.

National Leprosy Eradication Programme:

Under the National Leprosy Eradication Programme, New Case detection rate is 4.2 against the target of below 10 per 10,000 populations. Prevalence rate is 0.23 against the target of below 1 per 10,000 population. Deformed case percentage is 1.8.

Filaria and Malaria Control Programme

Puducherry is a non endemic area for Dengue, Malaria, etc. A limited out of Chikungunya was effectively controlled. Puducherry and Karaikal are now in the process of being declare of non endemic region of Filaria. Puducherry has placed in the **third place** after

Goa and Tamilnadu in **the eradication of lymphatic Filarilarial diseases**. This has been made possible due to effective implementation of Mass Drug Administration for control of Filariasis. Intensive action is also being taken on the affected places identified through GPRS method.

Primary Health care

The Primary Health care is delivered through the well established network of 39 PHCs and 81 Sub-Centres in the UT of Puducherry. Primary Health Centres are already providing extended hour of medical and nursing services. Regular **Insulin Injections** to Diabetic patients, Anti-rabies vaccines for dog bites are given right in the Primary Health Centres itself. More facilities have been extended to the PHCs and costly medicines like **Anti-Snake vaccines** / **Anti-Rabies vaccines** have been supplied to the CHCs/PHCs in additional to the major Hospitals. Internet connectivity has been provided to all the PHCs. Further to improve the nursing care services, a second ANM has also been provided to the PHCs. Recently, the Health Department has started screening-up of the population for non communicable diseases and as such screening-up of population of PHCs of Koodapakkam and Kosapalayam had taken up during the year 2013-14 in the first phase. During the year 2014-15, screening of population would be continued for control of non-communicable diseases.

Secondary Health care

Community Health Centres are functioning as First Referral Centres. There are totally 4 CHCs functioning in the UT as detailed below:

- Community Health Centre, Karikalampakkam, Puducherry Region
- Community Health Centre, Manadipet, Puducherry Region
- Community Health Centre, Thirunallar, Karaikal Region
- Community Health Centre, Palloor, Mahe Region

The CHCs are strengthened with new hi-tech medical equipments for providing sophisticated medical services to the rural people and special clinics are conducted to combat proliferating number of Diabetic and Hypertensive patients. Disease Specific clinics have also been started in all the CHCs. In all the CHCs, Operation Theatres are made operational and deliveries are being conducted.

Tertiary Health Care

General Hospitals are main referral institution for primary and secondary level health care facilities of the Union Territory as well as the neighboring districts of Tamil Nadu. There are totally 4 General Hospitals functioning in the UT and one for each region of Puducherry, Karaikal, Mahe and Yanam. Speciality and Super Specialities services are provided both to the in-patients and out-patients of the Hospitals. At the General Hospitals in the U.T. more than 5,200 patients a day are being treated. General Hospitals in all the regions are well equipped with vital equipments like 128 Slice CT Scan, MRI Scan, etc. and full fledged Operation Theatres and Licensed Blood Banks. In the Indira Gandhi Government General Hospital and Post Graduate Institute, a diagnostic and therapeutic equipment - Cath Lab costing 4.52 cores was commissioned on 28.11.2008. Cardiac Cath Lab is the 'State of the art' equipment used for performing Cardiac Catherization of complex congenital heart diseases, Coronary Angioplasty for Coronary Artery Diseases, Peripheral and renal angioplasty, Balloonoplasty and Pace-maker implantation. Kidney Tansplantation has also been done free of cost to BPL families. All the drugs for the outpatients are distributed at free of cost to the out-patients. In all the General Hospitals, Ambulance Services and Tele-**Medicine** facilities are functioning.

Health Educational Institutions:

Apart from providing a qualitative medical care service, the Health Department is also imparting qualitative Health Education to the students of the Puducherry at free of cost. Out of three institutions, Mahatma Gandhi Post Graduate Institute of Dental Sciences and Mother Theresa Post Graduate and Research Institute of Health Sciences are Post Graduate Institutions. The **Government Medical College** which is one of the premier institutions is imparting free Medical Education to the students of Puducherry. As per the guidelines of the MCI, infrastructure facilities and recruitment of faculties has to be made every year. Hence, annually there has been considerable increase in the requirement of funds for providing infrastructure facilities and payment of salaries to the staff and faculties.

NEW SCHEMES

In recent times, there has been considerable increase in the number of cases of non communicable diseases like Diabetes, Hyper-Tension, Thyroid disorders, Obesity, Cancers, mental health problems, etc. As such, this Department has started two new schemes – <u>Life Style Modification Programme & Emergency Medical Care and Rapid Health Services</u> – in

the 12th Five Year Plan. The main focus during the Annual Plan 2014-15 is to contain the increase of non communicable diseases through early detection, intensive awareness programme among public, encouraging continuous medication of the public for which <u>Non Communicable disease clinics</u> will be opened in the PHCs.

Under the National AIDS Control Programme, it has been proposed (i) to extend financial assistance of ₹1000/- pm to AIDS patients at ART centre, (ii) provision of nutritious food to the children affected with HIV /AIDS and (iii) Issue of free bus passes to HIV / AIDS affected persons to reach ART centre for treatment.

DEVELOPMENT OF INFRASTRUCTURE

- ❖ As a part of measure to strengthen the infrastructure facilities and to reduce infant mortality rate, "Paediaric Intensive Care Unit" and Neo-Natal Intensive Care Unit" has been inaugurated on 23.01.2014 in the Rajiv Gandhi Govt. Women & Children Hospital.
- ❖ The state-of-the-art Multi Slice CT Scanner has been procured for the Indira Gandhi Government General Hospital and Post Graduate Institute.
- ❖ Purchased two numbers of Ambulances for the Government General Hospital, Karaikal on replacement basis at a cost of ₹15 lakhs.
- ❖ It has been proposed to construct a building for the GNM School at Karaikal for which necessary action has already been initiated.
- ❖ It has been proposed to construct a building for the Multi-Speciality Hospital at Karaikal in the land already been acquired for this purpose. Foundation stone for this construction of the Multi-Speciality Hospital at Karaikal has already been laid at a function held on 03.03.2014.
- ❖ Ambulance services in the Karaikal region will be upgraded through provision of adequate life saving equipments and trained staff.
- ❖ New buildings for the Sub-Centres at Nallavadu and Kuruvinatham are ready to open. Almost 95 % of the building works have been completed in respect of the Sub-Centres at Nallavadu and Kuruvinatham. These new building will be inaugurated this year 2014-15 after completion of the remaining building works.
- ❖ Building works of the Trauma Care Centre at the complex of GH, Mahe would be taken this year and the balance work would be carried out.

- ❖ In order to check the incidence of Cancer among women, Hon'ble Chief Minister has dedicated "Mammogram" equipment to the public at a function held on 21.10.2013 at Rajiv Gandhi Government Women & Children Hospital, Puducherry. The Mammogram Diagnostic Equipment is used for identification of breast cancer and early detection of cancer avoids more complications and loss of organs.
- Land has been acquired for the construction of the Sub-Centre at Thattanchavady and land has been handed over to the Health Department in November 2013 at a cost of ₹17.62 lakhs.

NEW INITIATIVES / PPP MODE PROJECTS:

- To cope with the growing old age population, it has been proposed to strengthen the Geriatric Ward and Out-patient Department in the Indira Gandhi Government General Hospital and Post Graduate Institute at a cost of ₹1.80 crores including creation of separate wards in the Community Health Centres. Similarly the existing facilities in the Primary Health Centres will be upgraded to provide exclusive health services to the Geriatric patients.
- ❖ As a part of affording comprehensive treatment to the terminally ill or bed ridden patients confined to houses, it has been proposed to introduce the "Palliative Care" in the Public Health which utilizes multi-disciplinary approach to patient care to address physical, emotional, spiritual and social concerns that arise with advanced illness.
- Under the Non-Communicable Disease programme, screening of population at PHC level would be taken up in a phased manner. Non communicable diseases clinic will be opened at PHCs.
- ❖ To extend speciality and Super Speciality Services for the Govt. General Hospital, Yanam, a Memorandum of Understanding with Apollo Hospitals, Kakinada has been signed on 13th August 2014 for providing better health care for the residents of Yanam region.
- ❖ The Government of Puducherry has signed MOU with Aravind Eye Hospitals, Puducherry for screening of prematurely born babies for Eye related problems. A MOU in this regard was signed on 08.08.2013 with Aravind Eye Hospitals, Puducherry.
- ❖ The Government of Puducherry has started a Knee Transplantation Programme in the Indira Gandhi Government General Hospital and Post Graduate Institute and an MOU

has been signed on 08.09.2013. Dr. Madan Mohan Reddy, Senior Joint Replacement & Arthoscopy Surgeon, Appollo Hospitals, Chennai and his team has performed the Knee Transplantation to a patient on 21.11.2013.

INDIAN SYSTEM OF MEDICINE AND HOMEOPATHY

A Separate Directorate of Indian Systems of Medicine and Homoeopathy was established in March 2001. The ISM&H offers uninterrupted health care facility to the people and serving as alternative to Allopathic System with better therapeutic goals and peoples satisfaction. The Panchakarma Special Therapy Unit started functioning with overwhelming response from the public. The 10-bedded Government Ayurveda Hospital at Chalakkara, Mahe started functioning and is to be expanded with infrastructure development and facilities. Naturopathy & Yoga unit have been started to provide non-pharmacological treatment to the public. An Ayurveda Medical College started in Mahe in 2010-11.

- ❖ Started Diploma Course in Pharmacy (Ayurveda, Siddha & Homoeopathy) in Mother Therasa Post Graduate and Research Institute of Health Sciences in 2012-13.
- ❖ Improvement of Ayurveda Medical College at Mahe.
- ❖ ISM&H facilities have been started in all PHCs/CHCs /DHs in the U.T. of Puducherry with full Manpower.
- ❖ Special Clinics in Ayurveda like Marmam, Arthritis, in Siddha like Thokkanam and Varma Therapy, Geriatric Clinic, Diabetic Clinic and in Homoeopathy like Mother and Child Care, Allergic Bronchitis, Acute and Chronic Bronchial Asthma Special Clinic, Adolescent problems have been started in ISM&H Unit, Chest Clinic Upstairs, Puducherry

FOOD SAFETY

The new Food Safety Act FSSA 2006 has been implemented replacing PFA Act 1954 by the Government of India Ministry of Health and Family Welfare Services and the rules have been promulgated on 05.05.2011. Keeping in view, the Government of Puducherry has bi-furcated the Food & Drug Administration into two department viz., Department of Food safety and Department of Drugs. In order to establish a full fledged Food Safety Department with a view to identify and categorize the food business and Food Business Operators (FBO) in the Panchayat/Municipalities, inspect the premises of FBO, draw samples from FBO, evaluate and ascertain the quality of drinking water, review the disposal of wastes, investigate food Poisoning incidents, create awareness of Food Safety with the consumers and industries.

Aims & Objectives:-

- ❖ To ensure that all food intended for human consumption that is manufactured, prepared or sold in the Puducherry region complies with FSS Act 2006.
- ❖ To carry out inspections, audits, verification and surveillance of FBO in accordance with FSS Act
- ❖ To educate consumer & FBO.
- ❖ To prevent Food Poisoning.
- ❖ To ensure Private water supplies (Wells and Bore wells) are safe and comply with the legal requirements.
- ❖ To carry out Planned Food Sampling.

Food Premises Inspection:-

- ❖ Various types of inspection are necessary to check the quality of food and if found unsuitable, serve improvement notices. These inspections include:- Inspecting of raw material, water& ice, processing, Display of food, Utensils & equipment, cleaning& hygiene condition, Lighting facilities, Garbage disposal facilities, Pest control, Personnel Hygiene.
- ❖ Inspection also include to identify the number of training provided, corrective action taken for improvement notice, to identify number of incidents of food poisoning and remedial measures taken for.

Role of other agencies:-

❖ The Health workers (NRHM) of Primary Health Centre, Male Health Worker of Gram Panchayat and Village Committee are proposed to be utilized and to submit plan to the FSO of Taluk level. This plan included awareness of Food Safety Practices, Training, Registration, sample collection etc.,

Role of Law Department:-

❖ The services of Law Department may be utilized to the cases related to unsafe food by issuing penalties, holding enquiries, conducting Food Safety trials and referring the cases to the criminal courts. For this purposes appropriate officers of Law Department may be notified as per FSS Act 2006 and rules 2011.

FOOD AND DRUGS TESTING

The Dept. of Food & Drugs Testing (formerly Public Health Laboratory) was established during Vth Five Year Plan. The main objective of the scheme was to analyse food samples under the provision of the Prevention of Food Adulteration Act, 1954 and

Rules, 1955. Since, then this Laboratory is undertaking the analysis of food samples drawn by the Food Inspectors of Puducherry Govt. and from Govt. Organisation and Private parties, to check the quality and purity of food articles within the ambits of relevant P.F.A. Standard. In order to cater the requirements and to implement the new Food Safety & Standards Act, 2006, the Public Health laboratory was de-linked from the Dte. of Health & Family Welfare Services and termed as Department of Food & Drugs Testing vide G. O. Ms. No.08 dated 28-02-2011 of the Health Secretariat, Puducherry.

Since, the Public Health Laboratory is the only Scientific and Analytical Institution in the Union Territory of Puducherry, it is undertaking the analysis of Forensic samples (Toxicological aspects alone), Water samples, Drug samples, Excise samples, etc., in order to cater the needs of the Public and Govt. departments to establish the facts of scientific expert knowledge as evidence before the Court of Law to book the offender.

During the Xth Five Year Plan, it was earmarked to upgrade technical/analytical activities to detect the food contaminants (like Heavy Metals, Pesticide residues and Mycotoxins) Food additivies, in the routine course of food analysis under P.F.A. Act. And also to strengthening the Forensic section by creating additional facilities for Serology section, Physics and Chemical section, Biology section, Documention section, Finger Print section, Ballestic section, Photography section in addition to the existing Toxicology section. And also to upgrade the analytical work in the Excise section, to analyse various kinds of samples like Beer, Rum, Brandy, Rectified Spirit, Arrack, Toddy etc. Further additional facilities required to test Narcotic and Psychotropic substances like Morphine, Heroine, Ganja etc., under the various provisions of Excise Act, Cr.P.C., I.P.C., Psychotropic Substances Act etc. For this purchase, a two storied building is to be constructed and additional posts are to be created.

A single story building (ground floor and first floor) was constructed during IX th Five Year Plan and has been utilized for starting Drug Testing Laboratory. For the purchase of Drug Analysis, it requires distinguished section, such as Pharmacology, Pharmacognacy, Pharmaceutical, Bio-chemistry and Biology. Initially, it has been started Drug Testing with respect to chemical analysis of certain durgs. Under Xth Five Year Plan, it has been earmarked to undertake all kinds of Parameters mentioned in the different Pharmacopaes and Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940, for which additional building facilities required for different

sections. For this purpose, a three stories building to be constructed and additional posts are to be created.

For the Eleventh Five year plan ₹60.0 lakhs was earmarked for creation of posts, maintenance of machinery & equipments and purchase of minor equipments.

The Public Health Laboratory was de-liked from the Dte. of Health and Family Welfare Services, Puducherry vide G. O. Ms. No.08 dated 28-02-2011 and named as the Department of Food & Drugs Testing in order to implement the Food Safety & standards Act. The laboratory has to be upgraded according to the provisions of the FSS Act and accordingly, necessary accreditation has to be obtained from the NABL to make the laboratory suitable to cater the needs of the Act.

The Department of Food Testing Laboratory has a separate Drug Testing Laboratory for analysis of Drug samples and the Drug samples of legal nature collected by the Drug Inspectors will be analysed and the reports will be sent to controlling authority for initiating legal action against the defaulters, in accordance with the Drugs & cosmetics Act.

DRUGS CONTROL

The main aim of the department is to enforce the laws relating to Drugs & Cosmetics, Medical Devices and other Health care Products enunciated in the Rules & Regulations of various Act pertaining to this department. As an achievement for the year 2014-15, this department has issued 105 fresh licences to various drug industrial establishments, wholesale and retailers of drug sales concerns, which were stagnated for some period due to administrative reasons. Apart from the fresh licences, about 95 nos. of old licences have also been renewed. Further various licences were issued for manufacturing units and also renewed to the existing manufacturing units. Besides, issued large number of additional products endorsements, COPP, special permission, Good Manufacturing Certificate to the various manufacturing units. Till January 2015, a tune of ₹20.00 lakhs has been realized as Licence fees. The renewal of blood bank licence to various health institutions including Government institutions have also been carried out. From the above activities, the Government revenue has been considerably increased. Technical staff of this department have been deputed to various workshops and training programmes conducted by the Central Drugs Standards Control Organization, New Delhi and Chennai.

This department has also proposed to strengthen the department by creating the essential posts such as Drugs Controller, Assistant Drugs Controller, Drugs Inspectors and Establishment staff. Action will be initiated to install Fax machine. To start with issue of licences for retail & wholesale units in phases through ONLINE in the name of XLN INDIA with the help of NIC, Puducherry.

To control highly infectious diseases among the society through free diagnosis and treatment. Treatment and management of Tuberculosis and Non-Tuberculosis diseases. Leprosy control programme aimed at sustaining the elimination of Leprosy in U.T. of Puducherry. To provide in-patients care for old cured Leprosy patients with compilations due to deformities. To interrupt the chain of transmission of STD/HIV and AIDS. To reduce the risk of HIV transmission. Effective implementation of Mass Drug Administration for control of Filariasis. Prevention of Vector Borne diseases like Filaria, Malaria, Dengue, Encephalitis. Control of Blindness. Dental Health Care for Public.

3. Actual Physical Achievements made in the Annual Plan 2013-14:

- As per the guidelines of Government of India & WHO, the Health Department has extended a comprehensive treatment facility for the treatment of Tuberculosis along with full fledged diagnostic facilities. Accordingly an Intermediate Reference Laboratory duly accredited by the World Health Organization has been established in the Government Hospital for Chest Diseases which has state-of-art Bio-safety Level III facilities with sophisticated bio-safety cabinet for handling of MDR suspects samples as per the infection control measures. Recently, BACTEC MGIT 960 system is installed in the Intermediate Reference Laboratory for the follow-up culture MDR (Multi-Drug Resistance) patients.
- A month long Malaria Awareness Programme was conducted in various PHCs during the month of June 2013 and constituency wise work force has been developed for control of Dengue and the epidemic is under control.
- Anti-Larval activities and anti-adult measures for control of Mosquitoes
- Continuation of the Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme and Up-gradation of Multi-Drug Diagnostic facilities.
- Prevention of Vector borne diseases like Filaria, Malaria, Dengue, Encephalitis are done.
- ➤ Hand operated fogging machines have been supplied to avoid mosquito density.
- School children are screened for refractive errors and free spectacles are provided.
- The percentage of IOL implantation under National Programme for Control of Blindness is 99.50% and 15102 cataract surgeries were performed in the year 2013 14 against the target of 7,400.

National Leprosy Eradication Programme during 2013-14:

Since more number of MB cases are being detected, a search activity team has been constituted incorporating Health Inspectors, Health Assistants and ANMs of the concerned Primary Health Centres and Community Health Centres and search activities are started from April 2013 onwards.

- By this activity it has been planned to detect more number of hidden cases and to give early treatment to prevent deformities.
- Search activities are carried out by using Photo Flash Cards so that the public will visualize the different kinds of hypo-pigmented patches and have more awareness about leprosy and there will be voluntary reporting from the public which will enable the health officials to start the early treatment. IEC pamphlets are also distributed to the public.
- A Special programme for screening School Children has been started wherein Health Education in Leprosy is given in schools and also displaying flash cards to enable voluntary reporting from School Children.
